DAYTIME CHAPTER

On a beautiful Spring afternoon Keith Northcote welcomed 32 members, plus a very proud Granpa, (congratulations John and Bev Gay) to the March meeting.

The raffle plants for this months meetings were purchased whilst a few members were on the Clubs Melbourne excursion last year. Members were reminded of the Social events for the remainder of this year. John Gay then presented a very interesting talk, illustrated with a few slides, on growing Phalaenopsis with African Violets.

John and Bev have a room at one end of their home which was built especially to house their African Violet collection. As the Orchid Bug bit deeper and John felt the urge to expand his orchid genera he discovered that Phalaenopsis need similar conditions to the violets. John bought his first plant at the 1986 Orchid Conference and as that grew and flowered quite happily he has increased his collection. The Phalaenopsis grow in front of double-glazed windows that face south. 50% shadecloth is placed on a frame

FLOWER OF THE MONTH : ENCYCLIA *alata* grown by C. & H. Edwards

The Edwards's grow this plant in a fibreglass house along with the cattleyas and other miscellaneous orchids. The 3, 4ft long, spikes carried approx. 40, strongly perfumed, flowers per raceme.

Although John is experimenting with growing some of his 'phallies' in self watering pots, at present the watering is done by giving the plants a 'bath' once a week in fertiliser and just pouring water through twice a week. The temperature range in Summer is 30c - 15c and in Winter 25c - 15c.

The plants that won the 'election' were C. Kew grown by John Illman, a beautiful white phalaenopsis hybrid grown by Keith Northcote and *Encyclia alata* grown by Helen and Charlie Edwards.

The afternoon concluded with biscuits and a cuppa.

EXHIBITORS SHOW RULES

1. All exhibitors must be financial members of the South Coast Orchid Club of South Australia Incorporated.
2. Entries are free.
3. Exhibitors are bound by the Constitution, Rules and By-Laws & Special Show Rules of the Club.
4. The opinion of the Judges is final & binding & no objections or discussion regarding results will be considered. There is one exception & that is an infringement by an exhibitor of any of the Club's Laws, By-Laws, or Show Rules. Any objection in this case must be lodged with the Show Marshall.
5. The Club accepts no responsibility for any loss, damage or infection suffered by any plant or blooms exhibited.
6. The Club reserves the right to photograph any of the exhibit if it should wish.
7. In all matters regarding the arrangement & conducting of the Show, with the exception of matters pertaining to the judging, the Show Marshall is the ruling authority.
8. No plant suspected by the Club's 'Virus Adjudicators' of being infected with virus will be eligible for competition & such plant(s) will be completely isolated from all other plants.
9. The exhibition area will be closed during judging. No exhibitors, public or member other than the Show Marshall, Registrar of Judges, Judges & Associate Judges of the Club & other persons so appointed as to assist with the judging will be allowed to remain in the exhibition area during this period.
10. Non-exhibitors are requested not to congregate in the exhibition area prior to judging so that Officials can arrange plants & perform other necessary duties unhindered.
11. Plants must be labelled with the coloured labels provided by the Club with exhibitor's number & name of plant. Supply of these labels can be obtained from the Show Marshall or his nominee.
12. Exhibitors are to ensure that all labelling be neatly & correctly performed in accordance with the procedure laid down on Orchid Nomenclature & Registration. Labelling shall be legible from a reasonable distance.
13. All exhibits must be benched as directed by the Show Marshall.
14. Exhibits must be removed & the area cleaned as directed by the Show Marshall.
15. Exhibitors unable to remove their own plants from the Show should provide the person doing so with a letter of authorisation.
16. Damage caused in transit to the Show should be reported to the Show Marshall or Registrar of Judges prior to the commencement of Judging.
17. **If in the opinion of the Judge, a plant not being worthy of an award or prize in any specified section, then none shall be given.**

SHOW SCHEDULES

As previously stated in the Gazette the Autumn Show schedule is the same as for Monthly Meetings, with the inclusion of Grand Champion & Reserve Champion. However, the Show Schedule for the Winter & Spring Shows is on the agenda for discussion at the April Cultural Meeting.

Points worth noting -

- ◆ The Orchid Club of South Australia has only one more class for standard Cymbidiums than our old schedule (they have over 700 members compared with S.C.O.C. approx 140)
- ◆ O.C.S.A. Winter Show is judged by about 40 judges and has approx. the same number of plants as S.C.O.C. (S.C.O.C. will be judged by approx. 12 judges.)
- ◆ The majority of plants at the O.C.S.A. Autumn and Winter Shows are put in classes before judging commences to speed up judging. (See note above.)
- ◆ If a class exists judges must spend time searching for plants for that class even if none are benched.
