GENERAL ARRANGEMENTS

FRIDAY 21 September

There will be a working bee at 'Colonnades' commencing at 6 p m for the purpose of marking out display areas and erecting protecting fencing. Provided sufficient number of members attend the time should not exceed 2 hours. It is anticipated that fencing will be delivered to each level but if it is delivered to service area only then a vehicle will be used to transport same to upper level. Names will be taken at the September meeting of members willing to assist.

SATURDAY 22nd September

Displays to be arranged from 1 p m onwards. Entrance via service area for Open Division or unloading of vehicles 'on site' permitted provided that the vehicle is removed immediately it is unloaded. Upper level to be approached through entrance doors relative to the K Mart Store. Members are requested not to block the doorway. All displays to be arranged on the Saturday.

SUNDAY 23rd September

Judging to commence at 10 A M. All Judges, Associate and Student Judges members of the Club to attend.

OPENING OF SHOW SUNDAY 23rd September

The Show will be opened at 2.45 p m. and all Club members are invited to attend. Entrance can be obtained through the North Central door on upper level adjacent the Travel Centre. Major prizes will be presented.

PLANTS FOR SALE.

All plants for sale must be in good clean condition. Struck back bulbs must be established by root growth and be in a container approved by the Club containing potting media which will allow the bulb to grow on. Members must supply a list of plants on the form approved by the Committee and must not be just left but actually checked with a member of the Club nominated to receive them. No plants will be received after 4 p m on the Saturday; additional plants may be received during the Show provided that they are checked in the same manner as for those delivered on the Saturday. It is recommended that members retain a duplicate of the list which they tender to the Club. Plants to be labelled with the name of the plant, flowering time, colour, members number and price on labels.

REMOVAL OF PLANTS ON SATURDAY 29 SEPTEMBER

All exhibitors are expected to assist in the removal on this day and generally assist in cleaning up. This will commence at 12.30 on the Centre Court level and at 1 p m on the upper level.

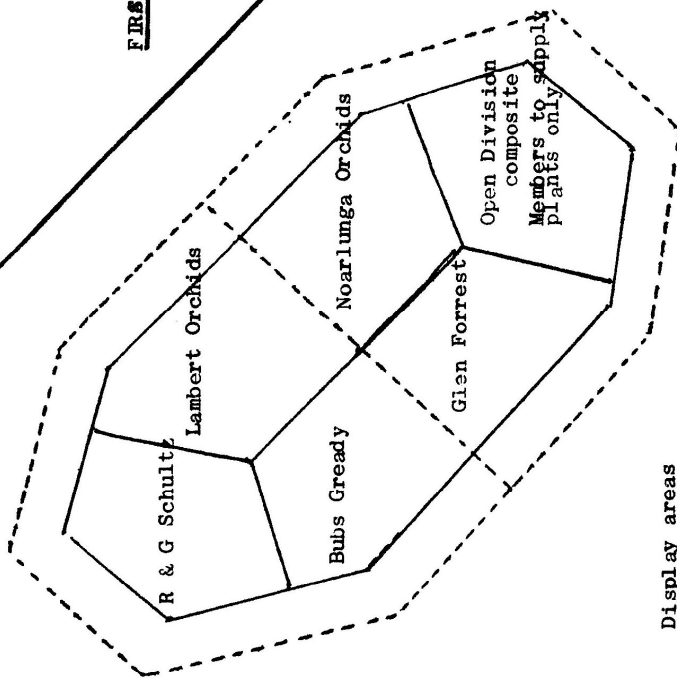
FUND RAISING 10TH AUSTRALIAN ORCHID CONFERENCE

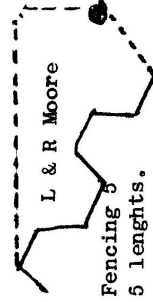

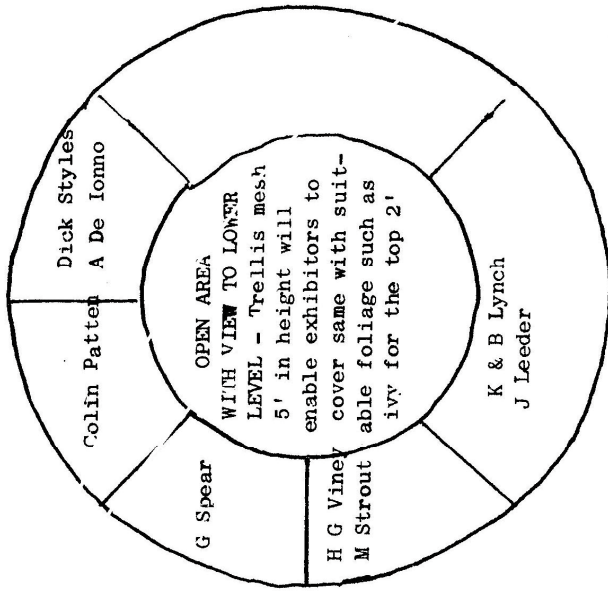


Display areas

N.B. - Although not shown provision exists for 1st and 2nd Division members to exhibit without arranging a display.

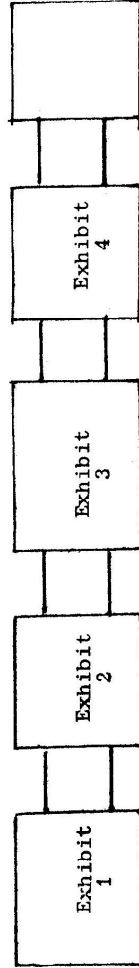


Outer circle is fencing boundary

**LAYOUT OF DISPLAY ON UPPER LEVEL OUTSIDE 'K' MART AND AT TOP OF TRAVELATOR.**

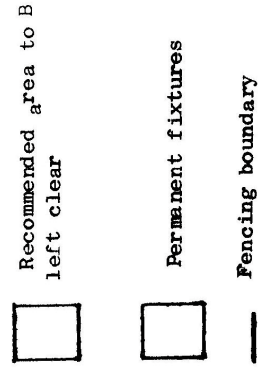
← To Centre Court      To Myers
