SINGAPORE ORCHID SHOWS

In March 2005 the Orchid World met in Dijon, France for the 18th World Orchid Conference. The site for the 20th World Orchid Conference was selected at that event. There were two major site contenders, Cape Town, South Africa and Singapore.

When the Orchid Society of South East Asia, Singapore was announced at the closing ceremony to be the host society for the 20th Conference, the release of emotions by the Singaporeans was something to behold. They were ecstatic!

Thus started a significant programme of development for the host society! In December 2006 they decided to be involved in a joint show. The Singapore Garden and Orchid Show was held in the huge Suntec Centre; very much supported and assisted by Singapore Parks & Gardens. Myrnie & I were invited to attend with me helping as a judge at the Orchid Show. This was very much a learning exercise for the OSSEA members and we were delighted to be a part of it. The show was very good and the entire event a huge success, even though its closing date was December 25th – we left on December 22nd to be home for Christmas.

In July 2008 they held another of these joint ventures; once again the orchid show offered clubs of the region the opportunity to show their club wares and many commercial vendors were on hand to sell at the many stalls. In addition to orchids and garden displays there were huge numbers of floral art presentations provided by professional designers as well as amateurs and an amazing number of school children and their parents.

Many of the displays need to be seen to be believed. Some of the garden displays would have taken weeks to prepare; much like the work done on Chelsea displays in London each year – in fact many of the designers have exhibited in Chelsea.

If these two preliminaries are anything to use as a yard-stick then the next WOC in Singapore will be one well worth the effort to attend.

OSSEA are planning another lead-up show in July 2010 and the WOC follows in November 2011. With this being the closest venue to Adelaide for a WOC for many years it will be well worth the effort to start planning a trip early. I am sure that you will come away from it with very good memories, regardless of the capacity in which you attend.

Flower of Open Division: *C. loddigesii* 'Danelle' grown by Richard and Beryl Wilson. A very nice and well grown example of this South American species found in coastal regions from Brazil south to Argentina and Paraguay. This species has been used extensively in hybridization. Flowers of this species can be quite variable in colour, the benched plant having well filled in flowers and was a good clear pink in colour.

Flower of First Division: *Lc. Interceps* 'Hindmarsh' grown by Heather Engelhardt. A nice example of a primary hybrid between the species *C. intermedia* from Brazil and *L. anceps* from Mexico. The flowers were 110mm wide and 120mm tall with pale pink sepals and petals that were a little paler towards the flower centre. The cream labellum had a deep purple edge to the mid lobe and pale pink to cream side lobes which curved up over the column.

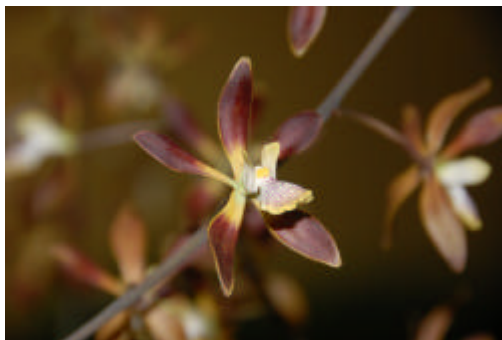
Night: C. Valentine Day benched by George Misirlis. The well grown plant had 5 inflorescences, four with all flowers fully open and well displayed, those inflorescences carrying 11, 11, 10 and 9 flowers. Sepals and petals were a glossy deep maroon shading to a slightly lighter tone near the flower centres. The labellum had a deep purple central lobe and pale pink side-lobes curved up over the column.



A few other plants benched:

Odcdm. Cherry Fudge 'Carmela' grown by Anne and Colin Campbell. A small plant with a single inflorescence carrying five evenly displayed flowers 60mm wide and 70mm tall. Sepals and petals were striped in very dark maroon over a greenish yellow base and had bright yellow tips. The broad labellum had heavy maroon markings over a cream base. Colin had bought this plant from a nursery as *Odcdm.* Cherry Fudge but he suggested that it had been mislabeled and is probably *Colm.* Wildcat.

Den. Chao Praya Moonlight 'Chartreuse' benched by Pauline and Mark Hockey. A plant with very attractive pale green flowers, 4 of which were fully open, one starting to open and 4 more still in bud on the single inflorescence. Sepals and petals were light green, labellum pale green with the mid-lobe finely striped and spotted in purple. Flowers were 65mm wide by 55mm high.



Enc. Bees Knees benched by Bev. and John Gay. A strongly growing plant with 3 tall branching inflorescences bearing well displayed flowers 35mm tall and wide. Sepals and petals were a deep purple-brown shading to deep cream towards the flower centre. The labellum was light yellow, the relatively broad showy mid-lobe was finely striped longitudinally in maroon.

BLACK SPOTS ON ORCHID LEAVES Brian Milligan

Virtually everyone who grows orchids has experienced black spots on the leaves of their plants. Zygotetalums are particularly prone to spotting but many other genera (especially those with broad, thin leaves) occasionally develop black leaf spots. Once these spots have developed, there is nothing one can do but wait for the affected leaves to fall naturally or perhaps to trim them with sterilised scissors if only a few leaves are affected. Leaf spotting seems to occur to a lesser extent if the plants are grown with good air circulation and watered early in the day so that the foliage becomes dry before nightfall. Surprisingly, other orchids, such as cymbidiums, growing beside the zygotetalums are generally unaffected.

Maxillarias, even those grown in heated glasshouses, are also renowned for their propensity for leaf spotting. Again, it may be minimised by providing good air circulation and avoiding wetting the foliage when watering. Some dendrochilum species with broad leaves, for example *Dendrochilum macranthum* (formerly known as *D. magnum*), also seem to be particularly susceptible.

Black leaf spots are generally attributed to attack by fungi or bacteria but this general observation is not particularly helpful, as there are a host of different fungi and bacteria, many requiring a different fungicide or bactericide for their control. I spray the orchids in my glasshouse once or twice each year with a systemic fungicide called Bavistin FL but still experience some leaf spotting; possibly a range of different fungicides would provide better control.

While some fungal infections that attack orchids spread rapidly and are often fatal to the plant, the type of leaf spotting described above is, in my experience, seldom fatal. Like the common cold, it seems to be a perennial problem, that the orchid grower must accept as one of the hazards of our hobby.
