AUTUMN SHOW 1991 Keith Northcote

show was a colourful event exhibiting a full range of expected genera and enjoyed by all members many of whom had benched a number of plants each. The plants were in good condition with several outstanding specimens, although the general flowering was perhaps a little below average in quality. Never the less it proved to be a most worthy show with a plant of Cym. Morialta fine 'Morialta Falls', grown by T. & M. Richardson, 1st Division, selected as Grand Champion of the Show. C. Chocolate Drop 'Kodama' grown by R. Moore, Open Division, was judged as Reserve Champion.

Cym. Morialta comes from a crossing of Cym. floribundum (formally pumilum) and Cym. Radak (Claudette x Pearl) registered by R.E. & M. Burns in 1985. The cultivar 'Morialta Falls' established itself as a reliable miniature Cymbidium capable of winning on the show bench- as in the present situation. The only serious problem is that the lovely pendulous spikes with their large number of flowers make difficult to transport the plant without damage. Cym. Morialta grows easily and well under the usual growing conditions used for Cymbidiums in the Adelaide region.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

From the Dept. of Agriculture S.A. Plant Services Division.

In 1980 live green snail (Helix Aperta) were discovered in the Perth area; the first time this voracious snail which attacks vegetables, cereals, ornamentals and native plants was found in Australia. An eradication campaign funded by the Commonwealth and States was implemented but by 1988 it was found that eradication was not possible. The eradication campaign ceased on 30 June 1990, but the W.A. Government continued with a control program. a consequence there is an increased likelihood of produce contaminated with snails being exported from the Perth area.

Since the green snail feeds on a wide range of plants and can produce a large number of eggs in a year restrictions have been placed on the importation of plant nursery stock, leafy vegetables and pasture fodder from W.A. into

Since all infestations of green Snail are well within a 55 km radius of Perth, plant nursery stock imports from this zone into S.A. must be accompanied by a W.A. certificate from the Department of Agriculture which certifies that the plant nursery stock has been produced from a plant nursery complying with the following conditions:

- plants produced in an accredited nursery of the Nursery Hygiene Accreditation System of the Nursery Industry Association of W.A. (Inc) as described in 1990.
- the accredited nursery is at least 2km from known green snail infestation.

3. baiting of the nursery with effective molluscocide an carried out.

Plant nursery stock produced outside the 55 km zone can enter S.A. provided it is accompanied by a W.A. Department of Agriculture certificate certifying that such plants have been grown and packed in an area outside of the 55km radius of Perth.

The South Coast Orchid Club Of S.A. Inc. CONSTITUTION

The Committee recommends that the following amendments be made to the Constitution.

Clause 11. Committee of Management

- (H)Subject to clause 11 (i) hereof any member of the Committee may hold more than one position on the Committee. Subject to the provisions of clause 11 (d) hereof any member of Committee holding more than one position on Committee shall only have one vote.
- (I)General members of Committee may not hold more than one position on Committee and accordingly must resign their position as a general member of Committee in order to take up any other position on Committee.

Clause 25. Extraordinary Measure

- (B) (i) not less than 30% of all financial members of the 1 Club are present, and (ii) the motion or any part hereof is passed by not less than two thirds (2/3) majority of these present and voting.
- The meeting of First Instance by majority decision may (B) (i) Temporarily suspend any member of Committee until the matter is determined: (ii) Appoint temporary replacements to Committee pending the final determination of any such motion of no confidence.

These amendments will be published in the next issue of the Gazette and voted on at the July cultural meeting.
