WORKSHOP - THE INTERNET AND ORCHIDS

Suzanne Saunders and Ron Parish, on behalf of SCOC, will be running a 2hr workshop on how to use the internet to research your orchids before purchasing. We'll be using various nurseries catalogues as a starting point but you can bring along a list of plants you are considering and we can look at that also. We will show you how to locate growing conditions for various species, whether or not a plant is registered, as well as looking at photos of the flowers, in the case of a mericlone or from similar plants and/or its parents, to give you some idea of what the flowers may look like when fully grown. We also hope to have a judge present to give some insight into how well a particular plant, given the breeding, may do on the show bench - no guarantees are given though! If there is enough of a demand, we will also place an order with a nursery on your behalf so that you can grow your collection in the right direction and become more successful on the show bench ... or to just enjoy your hobby/addiction that bit more.

The following information was published in June 2004's Gazette:

Merv Steel, Murray Baulderstone and Graham Shevlin met recently on instruction of the last committee meeting to consider the advantages and disadvantages of an alternative meeting hall.

South Coast Orchid Club has not always met where it currently meets, there is a growing number of members who feel the time has come for us to look seriously at the location of our meeting hall. It seems the majority of members live in the general Marion area and surrounds. One of the halls suggested is the St. Bernadette's Parish Hall, 1257-1259 South Road. This was the location of our Affiliated Societies meeting and voted by all there as a first class hall.

It is felt we would be closer to the metropolitan area, more orchid growers could possibly join.

The return trip to Christies Beach is a little more hazardous for a number of our members especially those that live in the general Marion area.

To find the hall is difficult.

The lighting is superior, we could show slides and judging take place together conveniently.

The hall is air-conditioned, cooling only at this stage.

As the hall is fairly well insulated it is thought it would be warmer during winter.

A first class kitchen.

Easier and quicker to set up tables as a trolley is provided.

Storage: Large storage area provided with own key.

Ample car parking. In the event of rain, cars can be unloaded under cover, and then be driven to a suitable park.

South Coast Orchid Club has a proud heritage. We have met at the current location for a number of years, and this has met our needs during this time.

Our meeting hall is clean, bright and sufficient seating with trestle tables provided.

Space to locate our cupboards.

Adequate kitchen facility.

Parking facilities quite adequate.

Cheaper rent (\$50 less per year) than the proposed hall.

Some members have joined because of its location.

If we relocated we could lose some of our current members.

The above proved to be an excellent decision. We are now one of the largest Orchid Clubs in S.A.

Benched Plant Commentary

Flower of Open Division and Flower of the Night:

Pleuro. tubatus grown by Ron and Irene Parish. *Plerothallis* is one of the largest genera of the Orchidaceae and is found in the mountain regions of the tropical Americas. Plant growth is in the form of thin or flattened stems arising from the base of the plant topped by a single leaf. The very small flowered inflorescence is produced at the point where the leaf joins the stem.



The flowers of this plant were some 4mm wide and 5mm tall.



Flower of First Division:

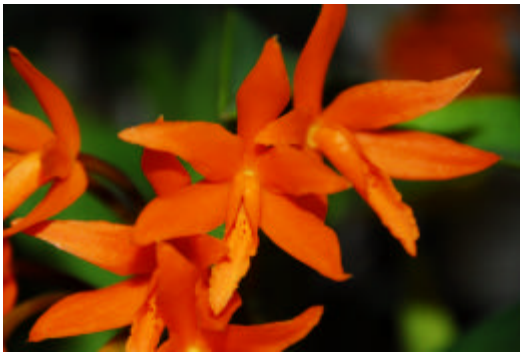
Cym. Little Beauty 'Sundaani' grown by Pauline and Mark Hockley. This is a hybrid of three Australian native *Cymbidium* species: *Cym. [(devonianum x madidum) x canaliculatum]*. There were five inflorescences arching down from the base of the plant with between 40 and 54 flowers, most of which were fully open. The flowers approximately 35mm wide and 35mm to 40mm tall with all over very dark sepals and petals very finely edged with pale yellow. Labellums were very dark maroon.

Flower of Second Division:

Phal. unknown grown by Rod and Judy McRedmond. This was a small plant with two inflorescences of six and seven flowers arranged along either side of the arching stems. The petals were purple-pink and cream at their bases. The labellum was cream and edged in the same tone of purple-pink.



A few other plants benched:



Lc. Chit Chat 'Tangerine' grown by Eileen Pinnock. A well grown plant with four inflorescences of 8, 9, 9, and 10 clustered bright orange starry flowers at their tops. The label-lums were orange with dark reddish spotting at the base.

Lc. Rosie's Surprise grown by Suzanne Saunders. Two flowers on a single inflorescence, well filled in and round being 120mm wide and high. The petals were lightly frilled. Sepals and petals were an even

deep lavender-pink, the frilled labellum was a similar shade, yellow at its base with darker hi-lights on the mid-lobe.



Iwanagara Apple Blossom 'Nora' benched by Noel Oliver. A well grown plant with a single inflorescence bearing four flowers 80mm to 90mm wide and 95mm tall.



The flower segments were cream, the sepals and petals finely edged in pinkish-lavender and the nicely shaped labellum was yellow at the base.
