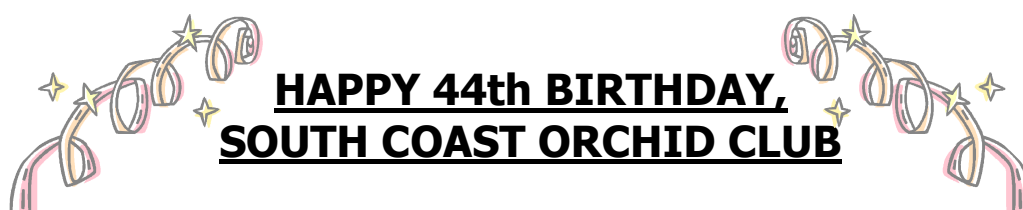

**Daytime Group Report**

Hi Everyone,

Our Guest Speaker today was Mr. Brian Lyttle with a power point presentation on his particular way of growing Zygopetalums, which he does very successfully. The presentation was very clearly and precisely done with Brian giving an excellent narration on the process of growing from pollination, sterilisation (cleanliness is paramount when doing any work in his lab). Brian then reflected back to his early days when just starting out when using Alcohol and a Bunsen burner, totally forgetting to let the Alcohol completely dry on his arms and gloves before sterilizing his tools and equipment with the Bunsen burner, very quick reactions were required quite a few times. We all laughed, but it could have been serious. Brian has had a huge Orchid house erected in his back yard to contain all his plants, this house is large enough to also contain a glass house which he uses for extra warmth for some of the different Genera he grows and for small seedlings. Brian is very enthusiastic about it all, going through all the different stages required to finally get them into their own individual growing pot. He also spoke on his potting mixes and fertilizers. All the members were impressed with a demo of how the pollen cap is removed from one plant to another, then all the information carefully put onto a tag on the newly pollinated flower stem. Well done Brian and thanks for a great afternoon of shared information and humour, it's great to hear people laughing, it certainly is the best medicine.

Apologies today from Peter and Geraldine Flavel, Marie Bravery, Margaret Wagner and Maureen Zoladzieski hoping all's well with you all and we'll catch up again soon.

Our display table today was filled with many different Genera, all very well grown and presented, congratulations to you all. Mr. Don Biebrick's species Zygopetalum "Crinitum" was judged best in display, well done again Don and its great to see you a bit more often, keep up the good work.

Thanks also to those who helped during the afternoon, it's great to have good back-up people, it certainly makes like a bit easier sometimes.

The meeting was closed, afternoon tea and a chat was had by all, thanking all in attendance once again.

## June 2009 Benched Plant Commentary

### **Flower of Open Division and flower of the night:**

An unknown hard cane *Dendrobium* grown by Peter and Geraldine Flavel. The plant had six canes, four still carrying their leaves, the largest and youngest two each bearing a single inflorescence with the larger one having eight fully open flowers and three buds and the other one with five open flowers and one bud.

The flowers were a glistening pure white, very clean and well displayed.



### **Flower of First Division:**

*Slc.* Burmese Gem 'Scientification' benched by Heather Engelhardt. A small plant with two inflorescences each bearing two flowers.

Petals were bright orange with red splashes on the tips and the sepals were also orange. The labellum was orange with yellow at the base and the mid-lobe was deep crimson.

The parents of this plant, registered in 1988, are *Slc.* Precious Stones and *C. aurantiaca*.



### **Flower of Second Division:**

*E. cochleata* 'Rita' grown by Paul and Donja Hayes. A well grown small plant with a single large inflorescence of eight nicely displayed open flowers and several buds still to come. The flowers were oriented with the labellum upwards, as is usual, and the narrow greenish-yellow petals and sepals pointed downwards. The labellum had deep red-brown striping on a yellow background and a band of the same colour around the edge.



### **Several other plants on the bench:**

*Paph. spicerianum* benched by Anne and Colin Campbell. A nice example of the species, the flower was 70mm wide and tall. The dorsal sepal was white with a central reddish stripe and some green at the base. The green sepals were frilled along the upper edge and had brown shading towards the ends. The shiny pouch was a greenish brown and the disc at the centre of the flower was lavender in colour.

*Z.* Titanic 'Monarch' grown by John Robinson. A large plant carrying five spikes, three with five flowers, one with four and one with three. The flowers were about 80mm across and 85mm high. The broad sepals and petals, with heavy dark brown blotches on a light green background, produced a nicely shaped flower and the labellum was in much the same plane as the other flower segments. The labellum was lightly frilled and was purple stippled and striped over the white base.

*Bllra.* Sadie Loo x *Milt.* Christmas Eve grown by Suzanne Saunders. A well grown plant with four spikes, one with four open flowers and two buds, one with four open flowers and one bud, one with two open flowers and one bud and the fourth with two open flowers and two buds. The biggest flower was 120mm across and 100mm tall. The purple sepals and petals were narrow with paler stripes and the purple labellum had darker purple blotches down the mid-line.

## **Natural Habitat, Propagation Techniques and Culture of Australian Native Orchids**

**Thank you to Les B. Burgess and NOSSA for allowing us to print this article from their February 2009 meeting.**

### **Natural Habitats**

- There are some 1300 taxa of Australian Orchids, of which some 1060 are terrestrials
- They grow mainly along coastal areas from upper Queensland down through New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia and about one third of the way up the Western Australian Coast
- The *rufa* group of *Pterostylis* frequent the more arid areas often around granite outcrops
- Terrestrial Orchids are amazingly tough and this last year there has been the appearance of some orchids not seen for up to 50 years
- Terrestrial Orchids grow in a variety of places from in under shrubbery to out in the more open areas
- They do not like competing for their habitat
- The main threat to their survival is man through land clearing resulting in destruction of prime habitat – Roadways and Housing Developers
- Mother Nature – Fires, floods and erosions



- Within various States there is significant work being carried out on the propagation of native orchids
- The two methods are asymbiotic and symbiotic culture in laboratories
- Hobby growers are supporting tuber banks
- Likewise these growers are now growing-on some stock for Government Departments
- Another often practiced method is tuber removal. In this case the new tuber is removed, the plant is replanted and kept growing thus tricking the plant into thinking something has eaten the new tuber
- The new tuber is placed adjacent to the side of the pot in which the plant is repotted
- This is practiced on *Diuris*, *Eriochilus* and some *Pterostylis*

### **Culture**

- Tonight we shall look at the care and culture of the more commonly grown terrestrials
- *Pterostylis*
- *Cyrtostylis*
- *Diuris*
- *Leptoceras*
- *Caladenia*
- When growing terrestrial orchids in the bush-house we must try to simulate natural habitat
- Therefore knowledge of where a plant grows in nature is most helpful
- Try to establish (perhaps recognise) micro climates within your orchid house

### **Potting Mixes**

- Let me begin by saying there are many potting mix recipes
- Not all of these can be used in South Australia and you will generally change the recipe to suit your own conditions
- What works for me may not suit your culture
- My potting mix consists mainly of course white propagating sand with some additional additives
- These are cheap commercial potting mix
- Blood and Bone
- Native plant fertilizer
- Dolomite Lime
- Clay
- To prevent potting mix loss from the pot cut a piece of old shade cloth or fibre glass flyscreen to roughly the diameter of the top of the pot
- Place this in the bottom of the pot covering the drainage holes

### **My Potting Mix for Terrestrials**

- 2 litres of Coarse washed propagating sand
- 2 litres of "cheap" potting mix sieved to take out the heavy (coarse) pieces
- Handful of blood and bone

### **For Diuris**

- 2 litres of "cheap" potting mix sieved to take out the heavy (coarse) pieces
- 1 litre of coarse washed propagating sand
- 1 litre of red drift sand or similar
- Handful of blood and bone

### **Tipping out a pot to find tubers**

- Pots should have died down
- Have dried out for at least two weeks
- Shake pots out over a sieve and bowl or tray
- Gently fracture the soil by slightly rotating the pot allowing the tubers to roll down the sides of the loose soil
- Pick out the tubers and grade
- Place large tubers in holding pot in preparation for show pots
- Small tubers can be placed in mother pots or spares for tuber bank sales

### **Repotting**

- Having placed the shade cloth or fly wire in the bottom of the pot fill it to within 25mm (1 inch) of the top
- Place the large tubers in a circular layout to cover the top area of the pot
- Cover with Casuarina needles

### **Watering**

- After repotting I dampen the pots during Summer every second day except when it rains
- During Winter let nature take it's own course
- In March, April wait for leaves to appear

### **Fertilizing**

- I DO NOT fertilize although I believe this may be undertaken in some States
- The Blood and Bone in the potting mix is sufficient for a year
- Over fertilization can cause deformities
- Other symptoms in leaf pattern can result from heavy fertilizer in commercial potting mixes

### **Housing**

- Some *Pterostylis* need extra shade for best results
- Others need to be protected from winds

### **Tips for flowering**

- For *Leptoceras* place some large tubers in a container with Banana skins for approximately two weeks. DO NOT put tubers on the skins
