On the Bench at the October Meeting

Flower of Open Division: *Lycaste* Shoalhaven grown by Richard and Beryl Wilson. A very well grown plant, each bulb larger than the previous one. *Lycastes* are deciduous, the bulb losing its leaves before flowering on the most recent growth, that bulb produced three inflorescences each with a single well displayed flower. The flowers were between 12cm and 12.5cm across and 10.5cm high, petals and sepals were cream with a pink blush and the labellum cream with a golden yellow calus. This is a hybrid heavily influenced by the species *Lyc. skinneri* and the flowers had the appearance of a much improved species flower.

Flower of First Division and Flower of the

Night: The species *Paphiopedilum micranthum* benched by Suzanne Willcox. A well-grown plant in a pot made from the bottom part of a green soft-drink bottle. There were at least five growths, each one larger than the previous one and at least two of the previous growths had flowered. The single flower, typical for the species, was 57mm wide and 75mm long. The sepals displayed pinkish purple venation on a light green base, the petals had deep striping on a pale greenish cream base with heavier pink markings around the edge. The inflated bulbous labellum was pink in colour.

Flower of Second Division: *Dendrobium x delicatum* grown by Ruth and Gunter Eckhard. This is a primary hybrid between *Den. kingianum* and *Den. speciosum* and is found in nature as a natural hybrid. The very large benched plant was covered in a mass of inflorescences (too many to count) carrying numerous cream to very pale pink flowers. A very clean and well-grown specimen plant.

October Meeting of the South Coast Species Society

On the usual first Monday of the month 26 members of the Species Society met at the Brighton Community Hall and were treated to a smorgasbord of fascinating species.

At this time of the year the Australian natives are at their best. There was a nice specimen of *Dendrobium jonesii* syn *ruppianum* carrying six racemes of pure white, feathery flowers. *D jonesii* is closely related to *D speciosum* and like that species does not flower reliably every year. This year appears to be a good year as it has been seen on many benches. There were two plants of *Dockrillia striolata* Syn *Dendrobium striolatum* in terra cotta pots, one was the more common green form the other a rarer yellow form. To grow this species successfully it is best mounted or in a terra cotta pot as they resent 'wet feet'.

There was a specimen pot of *Lycaste macrophylla* holding five lovely tan coloured flowers. This is a very variable species, colours ranging from clear green through tans, olive, and reddish brown to a deep chocolate brown. Seeing it at this time of the year is unusual as its normal flowering time is the winter months, May to July.

A plant of *angraecum eburnum* was brought in. It is a species from Madagascar, a large plant that carries flowers having a pure white labellum, green sepals & petals measuring 4-6cms long with a nectary or spur up to 7cms long on tall racemes. Although this species is from tropical habitats it will grow and flower in a cold glass-house in Adelaide.



In addition to those mentioned there were Cymbidiums, Cattleyas, Laelias, Gongoras, Vandas and many more. All the plants were discussed and cultivation tips were given. To round off the evening we enjoyed a cup of tea and biscuits.
