Polycynus muscifera

Polycynus muscifera is a smallish species from central South America and when not in flower looks a lot like a small *stanhopea* or *gongora* plant.

The flower stem is up to about 600mm with many small flowers of about 1.5 cm and which are supposed to look like swans in flight.

I grow my plant alongside my *gongora* orchids. It flowers about this time of the year I grow it in Sphagnum moss in an open weave hydroponics pot.

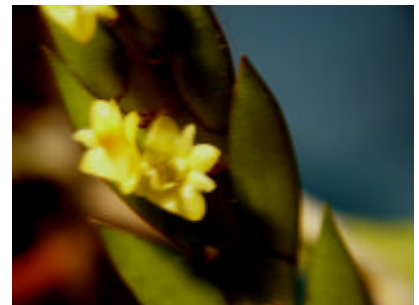

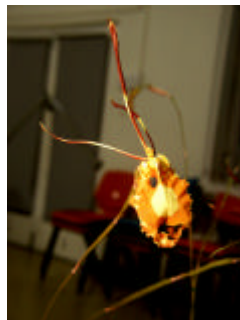
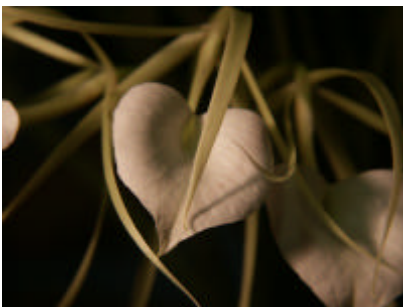
South Coast Species Group

The new Orchid Species Group held its inaugural meeting on Monday night the 4th of March at the South Brighton Community Hall. The 11 members who were present were welcomed by the South Coast Orchid Club President Murray Baulderstone. There were apologies from two intending members and it was indicated by some of those present of a further 6-8 people that would be interested but were unable to attend this particular night. It was decided that the venue for this group would be a sit around the table and discuss the plants brought in by the members. There was a fine array of species covering 5 or more different Genera with some 14 species displayed. A general discussion as to how those present wished to run this group was mulled over and all were very happy to have it informal. Noel Oliver started the night rolling with an Australian Native Epiphyte Species *Sarcochilus ceciliae*. Noel explained to the group the habitat and growing habits of this species and also explained how you tell the difference between *Sarcochilus ceciliae* and *Sarcochilus rosea* both of which look similar to the unwary. From here on each person discussed his species and how it was grown and where with constructive input from others that had some specific knowledge of that species. A most enjoyable evening and credit goes to Ron Parish for his efforts in not only kicking this group off but also for recording the various species with digital images. David Harmer.

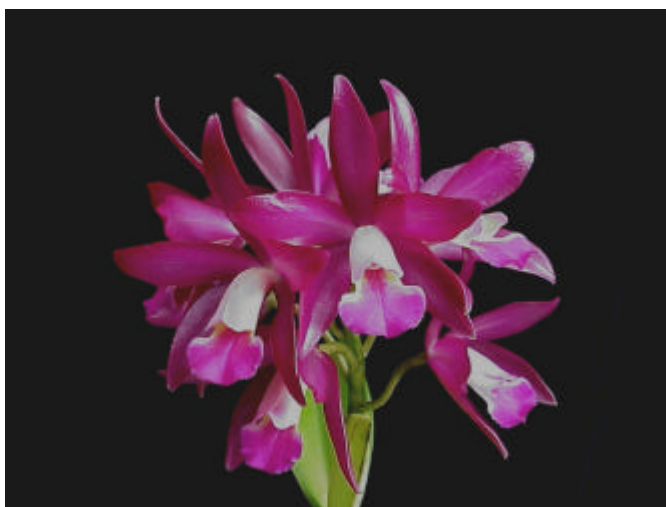
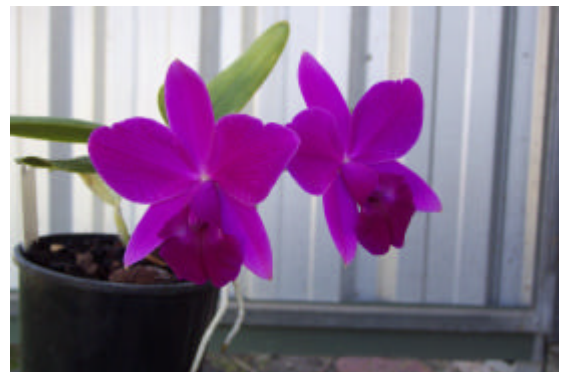
