Conduct of election.

The Constitution of the Club requires that the election of officers be by ballot. The ballot paper will be distributed on the night of the Annual General Meeting and voting will be conducted during the meeting.

The candidates will be introduced to the meeting prior to the conduct of the ballot.

To cast a valid vote, members should place a cross (x) beside the candidate of their choice.

Eligibility to vote

All financial members of the Club are eligible to vote, i.e all members financial as at the 31st December 1993.

Members unable to attend the meeting may appoint a proxy to vote for them.

Clause 24 of the Constitution defines the requirements that must be met for proxy voting. That clause reads -

Any member may appoint another member a proxy under the hand of the member and witnessed by another member and every such instrument of proxy whether for a specified meeting or otherwise shall, as nearly as circumstances

will admit, be in the form set out below namely :-

The instrument of proxy shall be produced by the proxy at the meeting. Where a member wishes to appoint the Chairperson as his proxy, the name and address of the Chairperson need not be included in the form of proxy but only the word 'Chairperson'.

Other appointments i.e. Show Marshall, Registrar of Judges, Editor of the Gazette, Publicity Officer, Librarian, Daytime Chapter Convenor, Tea Person, Trading Table Convenor, Publicity Officer, Hosts or Hostesses etc are all appointed by the committee.
