#### HOW TO CARE FOR YOUR CYMBIDIUMS

#### Plant Requirements

#### September to the end of Navember

- 1. Use a balanced fertilizer with high nitrogen feeding. e.g. Aquasol,
- 2. Feed at least once during this period with iron chelates
- Using Epsom Salts, 1 teaspoon to 5 litres of water once a month is also beneficial.
- 4. Feed at least once a week, if you so desire you can feed every time you water by using 1/2 recommended strength as shown on the packet.
- If using a slow release fertilizer apply early in September, and by covering the pellets you gain the best results.
- 6. Have Compost slightly acid
- 7. insecticide spray three times five days apart, using a wetting agent is beneficial. However should you still have plants with spikes take care and do not spray them
- 8. A soil fungicide through the pots is not a bad idea during this period.

#### Daontoglossum pulchellum Lindl.

An erect epiphytic plant growing in large clumps, having glistening white flowers with a perfume.

Introduced into cultivation from Guatemala by John Bateman and probably collected by the well known George Ure Skinner.

Odont.pulchellum was described in 1841 by John Lindley in the 'Botanical Register'. Some authorities follow R. Sclechter who transferred it to the genus Osmoglossum in 'Feede, Repertorium Beihefte' 1923.

(Reference-The Manual of Cultivated Orchid Species Helmut Bechtel, Phillip Cribb and Edmund Launert Revised edition)

As neither Handbook on Orchid Nomenclature and Registration nor Sanders List of Orchid Hybrids give Osmoglossum an abbreviation or mention the plant from the August Cultural Meeting have been listed as Odontoglossum.

#### ON THE BENCH

Zygopetalum John Banks resulted from a crossing of Z.Blackii X Z.crinitum, registered by Wyld Orchids in 1975. A very fine form from this cross was 'Purple Lips', as the name suggests having a very large deep purple coloured labellum.

At the turn of the century twenty or more zygo hybrids were registered, then no more work was done on them till the late 1950's. In more recent years we have seen beautiful hybrids for example, Z. Blue Lake and Z. Titanic both registered by Adelaide Orchids, who are continuing on with their hybridizing programme in this genera.

The primary species Z.mackayii, Z.intermedium, Z.crinitum, Z.brackypetalum and Z.maxillare are beautiful especially when grown to specimen size plants. The hybrids aimed at broader flower segments and stronger colours and much has been achieved in that direction in recent years.

The hybrids in addition, all have been able to retain the distinctive perfume of the species.

Z.John Banks 'Purple Lips' exhibited by Tony Brady on the 2nd Division Bench was only a small plant with intensely coloured flowers with very large labellums.

It is interesting to note that Z.John Banks 'Purple Lips' was the zygopetalum used in the breeding of the very complex hybrid Hamelwellsara June

#### Helpers for Judging at The Spring Show

Anyone who can help being runners, or recorders, please see Brenda Lynch at the Next Cultural Meeting.

The Club would like to have some new Genera Cards made up in different, Colours for the Cultural Meetings, if any members who can help with signwriting for the cards please see Brenda Lynch.

Sc.Batemanniana (Soph.coccinea  $\times$  C. Intermedia aquinii). There are several varieties of this plant available some being 'Hawaii', 'Lea', 'Sugar Plum', and 'Good Hope'. This is as unusual flower, pale pink with darker stripes and splashes in the petals.

Sc.Carol Lynn (*C.walkeriana X Soph.coccinea*) variety 'Nakabayashi' is the usually offered for sale. It is a small grower with a purple flower with a yellow throat.

Lc.Pink Favorite (*L.milleri X C.walkeriana*) varieties 'Hawaii' and 'Tokyo' are probably the best known. this plant falls into the micro mini category and have purple blooms with a yellow throat. Jack Woltman from Hawaii who visited Townsville last year frequently uses it in his breeding programmes.

C.Small World (C. luteola X C. aclandiae) one you see in books to make the mouth water. A greenish colour with brownish spots and a purple lip.

Blc.Waikiki Gold (Blc.Pink Surprise X *C. forbesii*) there are three well known varieties these being 'Lea', 'Uno' and 'Fumi' a pretty yellow with a fringe of pink around the edge of the lip. I have only seen 'Lea' in bloom and it tends to vary greatly from blooming to blooming, (as many plants do), but when it flowers at it's best it is a top bloom. Lctna.Peggy San (Lc.Peggy Huffman X *Bro.sanguinea*) the only variety which I have seen offered for sale is 'Cynosure'. This is a splashed petal *Broughtonia* cross. It is the usual *Bro.sanguinea* colour with pinkish splashes in the end of the petals. These flower at an unreal size, two and a half inch pot size being blooming size and sell for \$50.00 each. Slc.Bellicent (Lc.Bonanza X *Soph.coccinea*) variety 'Dark Mischief' is the variety advertised for sale, it is said to be a dark rose colour of excellent shape. The cross goes from one extreme to the other *Soph.coccinea* being very small and Lc.Bonanza being a large 6" flower. Sl.Marriottiana (*L.flava X Soph.coccinea*) I have not seen a mericlone of this plant offered for sale and the only one I have seen bloom is the pretty golden yellow which is very heavily marked with red. This is a micro mini with blooms of a full shape and about 1" across.

Slc. Tangerine Imp (Slc. Tangerine Jewel X C. luteola) there do not appear to be mericlones of this plant available yet. I have seen several seedling crosses in flower and they have been yellow, orange and red so they obviously follow Slc. Tangerine Jewel in colour, and size of the flower is similar or a bit smaller than Slc. Tangerine Jewel.

I have not discussed the Cattleytonia crosses because they are so numerous that they require an article to themselves to do justice although at this stage it is suffice to say that the majority of the plants look alike as do the blooms with a few notable exceptions.

The above named plants are but just at the tip of the iceberg in the newest area of the Cattleya alliance. Like all other areas of orchid growing be prepared for more disappointments than success when your seedlings start to bloom.

There is no recipe for obtaining seedlings which give the sought after results when they flower perhaps with the exception of buying mericlones of plants you have seen in flower and which you consider are your type of orchid. One day towards avoiding disappointment but by no means fool proof is to buy plants bred from parents which have shown desired results in other crosses.

In this regard from the above listed plants we see that plants such as Sophronitis coccinea, Laelia milleri. Laelia briegeri, Laelia pumila, Cattleya luteola, Cattleya walkeriana and Broughtonia sanguinea in the species area and hybrids such as Slc.Tangerine Jewel, Slc.Little Beamche (this plant has performed well as a parent), Slc Jewel Box and Slc.Hazel Boyd to name but a few.

No doubt we are going to see and hear much more about these "little fellows" and there is no doubt that some are very eye catching and beautiful but I say fortunately here in the Townsville area we are able to have the best of both worlds, whilst still growing ordinary Cattleyas we are able to also experiment with some of the small growers and are not forced to concentrate on small growers exclusively because costs associated with providing heat to help the plants grow.

#### HOW TO CARE FOR YOUR CYMBIDIUMS

#### POSITION

You can grow Cymbidiums outside in a protected position. They will survive a light frost, but this is to be avoided where possible. In Spring, Summer and Winter some shade is required, 50-75% being ideal. An overshaded position where the day lengths are short should be avoided where possible. Keep the pots off the ground to create good drainage, which is always essential, and to keep pest from congregating under the pots. When the plants are in flower they may be brought inside providing

- 1. Keep them well watered
- Take the outside for fresh air every couple of days
- 3. Remove the flowers after 6 weeks.

After flowering repotting should be carried out where necessary.

#### WATERING

When Cymbidiums are grown in open mixes overwatering is very unlikely to occur, remembering that ND orchid likes to be continually wet or have wet feet, therefore it is essential to see that the pots have adequate drainage. In Summer you will need to water more frequently and on hot days in the evening give the plants a good misting over the leaves. When in doubt don't water but when you water give a good watering and keep doing so until water runs freely out of the drainage holes in the bottom of the pots. In Winter it is better to keep the plants on the dry side.

#### **FERTILIZER**

There are many fertilizers on the market, some foliar and some slow release.

Foliar - Nitrosol, Fish Emulsion, Aqua-sol etc.

Slow Release - Osmoctote, Nutricote

Remember Orchids like to be fed a little but often, many growers recommend to give foliar fertilizer in the growing season at 1/2 strength weekly (some growers feed every time that they water with a more diluted strength) Slow Release - put around the top of the pot during September at the rate of 2 teaspoons per 200mm pot.

#### PESTS AND DISEASES

Red spider mite and scale are the two main problems, a spray with "ROGOR" every 6 months is a good control. PLEASE TREAT ANY SPRAY WITH CAUTION. USE ONLY AS MANUFACTURER'S DIRECTION AND TAKE NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS

If your plants have black spots on the leaves use a fungicide such as "BENLATE" or "FONGARID" as per directions on the packaging.

When in doubt PLEASE make enquiries either at a nursery or a Club member.

#### REPOTTING

Possibly this is the most important factor in growing Cymbidiums. This should be carried out every second year. Always standardize your potting mix i.e. have ALL your plants in one mix. Remove your plant from the pot and shake all the old potting mix out of the roots. Any bulbs that have no leaves may be removed. Now is the time to divide the plant if it necessary. It is advisable to retain plants with at least 4 bulbs. With a pair of snips, which have been sterilize by passing through a flame, remove all roots which are soft or dead. Take a pot which you consider will take the root growth over the next two year, place your plant against the edge with the new growth in the centre. Fill the pot with mix shaking the pot regularly to have the mix work around the roots. Never cover the bulbs, fill the pot to just below the rim of the pot, and ensure the compost isapproximately 1/8 the way up the bulb and ram the compost in as tight as you can around the edge of the pot. If your plant is loose then by using a stake and tying the plant to it the plant will not rock about and damage the new root growth

#### **PANCAKES**

Easy enough for the Man of the House to try

You need:

Half a pint of milk

Two eggs 110gms flour Pinch of salt Golden Syrup

Preparation:

Sieve salt and flour into a basin. Add eggs and beat well. Add milk to make a firm smooth batter. Gradually beat in the rset of the

milk.

Cooking:

Put 3/4cup of butter into a frying pan. Heat until first sign of haze. Then pour off and set aside. Leave a thin film of butter in the pan. Quickly pour enough batter into pan to make thin layer and cook. As soon as bubbles appear, toss the pancake (if you aren't game turn over with spatula). Flip the finished

pancke onto a pre-heated dish.

For the next pancke cover the bottom of the pan with hot butter and pour off again. Cook, flip on top of the first one. And so on.

Serve:

Serve pancakes as hot as possible fold once and top with Golden Syrup and a squeece of

lemon.
