AUTUMN SHOW: There was an excellent benching of a great variety of orchid genera at this show when Mr and Mrs Ray Goodall took out the Championship with a particularly well grown and flowered plant of Den. Impact, and Mr Jack Lewis showed a lovely plant of McIna. Pagan Love Song which gained Reserve Champion. Indeed all exhibitors are to be congratulated on the very high standard of plants that we have come to expect at our Autumn Show.

ON THE BENCH: A beautiful plant of Den. Impact, grown by R.and I. Goodall, 1st Division, was selected as GRAND CHAMPION of the Autumn Show. The plant was not large, but carried 2 long arching spikes, of well-formed, clean, fresh flowers. The colour was clear, bright, pink and white.

Den. Impact comes from a crossing of Den. Fiftieth State, and Den. phalaenopsis, made and registered by Kevin McFarlane of Cairns, in 1970. Den Fiftieth State, appropriately enough, bred in Hawaii by Cavaco, also has Den. phalaenopsis as one parent, with Den. New Guinea the other. Den New Guinea is a crossing of 2 New Guinean species, Den macrophyllum and Den atroviolaceum. The colour of Den. phalaenopsis, the famous Cooktown orchid, discovered by Captain Cook, and desired for its intense rich magenta colour. has been

softened by the mating with the 2 New Guinean species, which have creamy-white or yellow petals, with purple markings on the lips.

Den. Impact grows well in high temperatures. It should be watered freely while growing, but allowed a complete rest after flowering. The flowers are extremely long lasting, and appear on long spikes from the top of the completed bulb.
