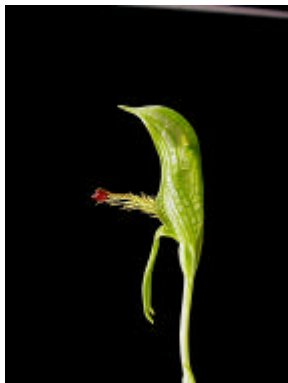
## A rich find of Australian Natives..

On a recent work visit to Mt Gambier I had occasion to make a roadside stop somewhere between Keith & Padthaway. While taking some exercise I walked a way into the bush and there in about an area of a large house block I saw some 10 different species of ground orchids in flower.

By far the most common orchid was (I think) *Caladenia carnea*. This little plant was prolific and came in all colours from pure white to a deep cyclamen.

***Cym. Gurrana 'Mignon' Grown by Malcolm Young.***

The 31 flowers on this plant were pale pink with some darker pink lining on the petals and sepals. The pink lip had some dark spots near the tip and bright yellow into the throat. There were 3 spikes from 11 growths growing in a bark and isolite mix.

## Flower of the Division

### *Dockerillia linguiforme* grown by Michael Cunningham

This plant was growing on a Melaleuca wood mount and had approximately 35 inflorescences-having very many small 25x25mm white flowers. Individually the small flowers are quite unspectacular, however the multitude of flowers on many inflorescences produces a good overall effect especially when the flowers are fresh and clean as in this case.

## **OCTOBER FLORAL COMPETITION RESULTS**

What a beautiful display the benching at this meeting made.

As usual there were excellent quality plants displayed. It was interesting to see and compare the two *Cym. canaliculatum* x *Midnight Muffet* seedlings that were benched. One had many pendulous spikes of greyish burgundy flowers while the other had several upright spikes of burgundy almost black flowers. These were part of a batch which members purchased from the club several years ago.

### **Open Division**

#### ***Flower of the Division and Flower of the Night***

#### ***C. skinneri* var *alba oculata* grown by Richard and Beryl Wilson**

This was a magnificent specimen of the alba form of this *Cattleya* species with 36 pristine white flowers in prime condition. These were carried on 9 spikes of between 2 and 6 flowers of around 95mm width. It was grown in a 200mm squat pot in straight bark.

*C. skinneri* is found naturally in Mexico, Guatemala, and Honduras, but is most common in Costa Rica where it is the national flower. It grows as an epiphyte on trees in humid forests and also as a terrestrial on granite slopes up to 1200M altitude .

The most common form we see is rose to purple coloured with a creamy white throat
