## **N**ATIVE TO HAWAII

Although Hawaii is famous for orchids (and palm trees, grass skirts etc.) the majority of the orchids are imported. Many different genera, in many different shapes and colours are grown prolifically throughout the Islands and are the basis for the nursery and floriculture industries. Although not 'natives,' many have been hybridized by Hawaiian hybridists, including hobbyists and commercial growers.

Hawaii's native orchids number just three and are quite rare, usually only seen by keen hikers.

Most of us would guess that the endemic orchids are probably from the *Dendrobium* or *Vanda* genera, but not so.

*Liparis hawaiiensis* can be found growing on most of the main islands. (Although not mentioned in any species book we have in our library I believe this one has small flowers). It grows in wet rain forest areas but like many small plants is threatened by introduced weeds, fire and animals.

*Anoectochilus sandvicensis* is also a lover of the dense shade and wet forest areas.

*Platanthera holochila* is now believed to be extremely rare. From photos, this little gem is similar to Lady's tresses or *Spiranthes* that we occasionally see on the Show bench.
