TERRESTRIAL NATIVE ORCHIDS MONTH by MONTH by Les Burgess

This month all the waiting and hoping should be starting to pay off. Due to the funny season we have had this year most plants are flowering later than usual. *Pterostylis curta*, *concinna* and Nodding Grace should all be in flower and be an eye-catching display. Late *Pterostylis* will be in spike ready for the Spring Shows. *Diurus* will be showing spikes but *Thelymitra* and *Caladenias* will be a little later.

The main thing is to keep a keen eye open for slugs as in just one night they can ruin your favourite pot of orchids. The plants **should** have had enough rain to keep the plants growing.

Pull out weeds as soon as they are seen as the longer they are in the pot the bigger the root system. Don't be like me one year, I pulled out some *Diuris* that I thought were weeds. Now I check twice before removing weeds.

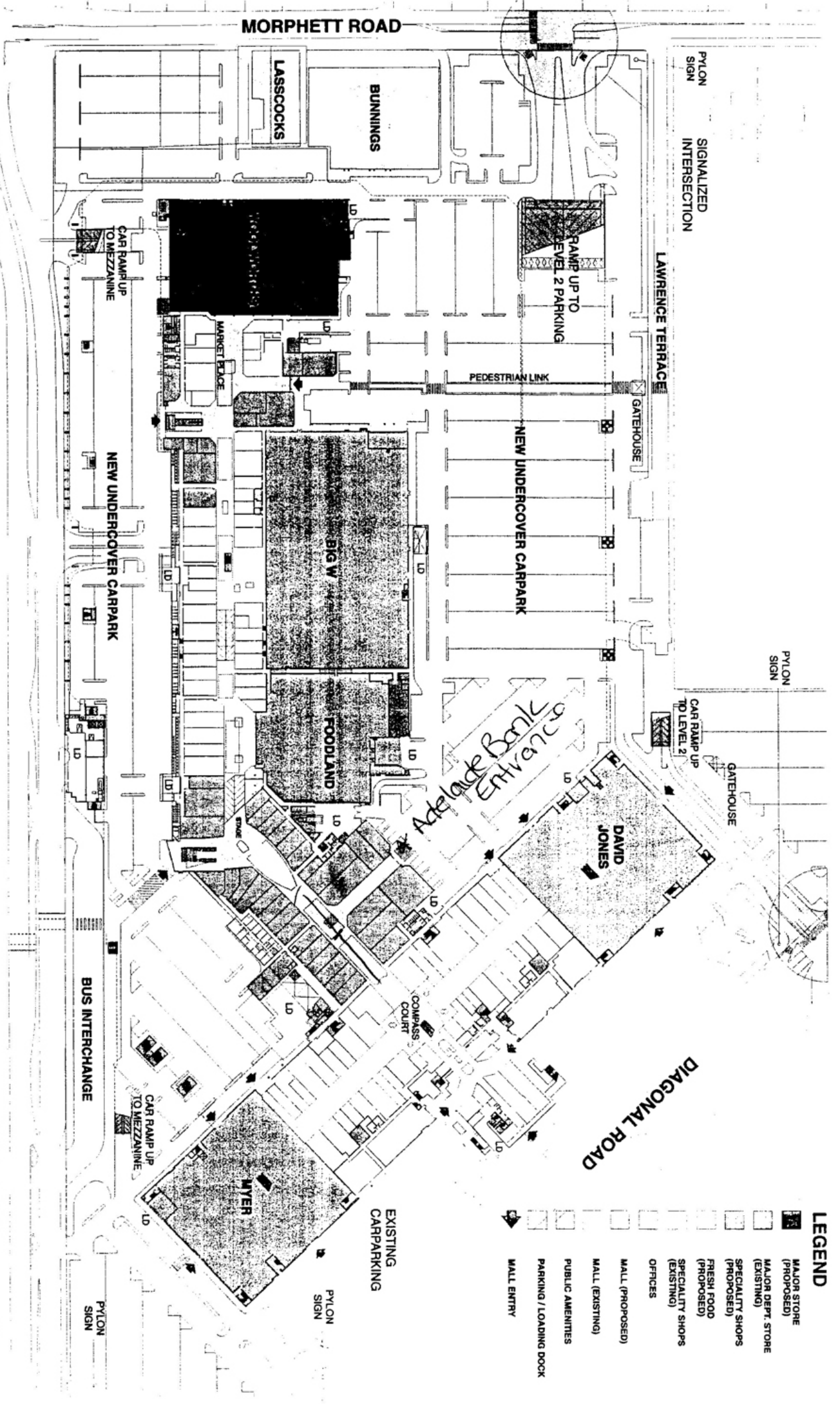
