# SPECIAL IMPROVED METHOD OF REMOVING ORCHID SEEDLINGS FROM FLASKS -- (written by Tom Henry P/Ltd.)

For 500 Ml. flasks, a 5" or a squat 5" pot is sufficient size.

Fill pot to about 2½" from top with seedling compost. Place small layer of sphagnum moss over compost. Make sure the compost is wet and

the sphagnum moss is damp.

Break the flask by wrapping it in newspaper and hitting with a hammer on concrete. They break easily. Keep the seedlings in one clump and carefully place them in the pot with the agar intact - loosely fill around the plants with sphagnum moss - water right away.

In cold weather, place 2 x 10" stakes in the pot, cover with a clear plastic bag - make sure the bag is tight around the top of the pot, place it in a bright, warm place where sufficient moisture is

released to the plants with condensation.

This is easily the best and quickest method of transplanting and you don't lose a seedling - even the corms grow!

# Floral Art

The next Monthly Meeting will be held at the Lutheran Kindergarten Hall, Christie Downs on Tuesday, 7th August, at 7.45 p.m.

With the Winter Show behind us, we can now look forward to preparing for a successful and enjoyable Spring Show, so this month we will analyse one of the Division 1. arrangements on the Spring Show schedule, viz, "Cool Beauty."

Let us take the first word 'Cool.'

As colour has a strong bearing on this, let us look at the so-called cool colours on the colour wheel. They are the receding colours from green through blues to violet. White can also be included, as this is one of the neutral colours.

Another way of portraying the word, is the use of stones or wood in water, then building your arrangement into this setting.

Yet another, is using water to advantage, this can be done by using a low container in which the arrangement has been placed at one end, in this way, more water would be visible.

Next is 'Beauty', which means, a combination of qualities that delight the sight, e.g., 'A Good Arrangement. So, combining the two words, we come up with an arrangement that should convey a feeling of coolness and give pleasure to the beholder.
