HELPFUL HINTS

This month sees the start of a new year for Cymbidiums. Albut the late flowering plants should be repotted by the end of the month. It is also the time to put into practice all good resolutions to bring about improved cultural conditions for your plants. See that they have the correct amount of light, water and fertilizer. The correct combinations for this depends on the compost you use, your locality, and the amount of sunlight received - (day light hours), so it really is a matter of observation, perhaps trying a as compost or fertilizer with a few plants to begin with - this being a guide to future use. Also talk to other growers about various methods used.

Homework for this month will be free choice; this will give you an opportunity to stage any arrangement you have been working on or any arrangement you are not quite sure is correct.

DEMONSTRATION

Line, Balance and Rhythm

WORK IN CLASS

As the shows for this year are now over we can start thinking of next year's shows, so for work in class please bring along containers and materials and also ideas for arrangement you would like to try out. Maybe you have an unusual container or one you are having difficulty with; bring same along. The same with your materials, either fresh or dried; bring them also but try to get a few extra pieces in case they are needed for either good balance or to get good rhythm running through the arrangement. Whilst working on the arrangement in class, emphasis will be mainly on good balance, line and rhythm. Think of these principles and elements of design when selecting your container and material.

BALANCE What is balance? I have written several articles on balance but seeing it is probably the most important principle in floral art maybe it is worth repeating, especially for some of the new members. Balance is achieved when the elements (space, line, form, pattern, texture and color) of a design is so composed that they give a feeling of stability, that is, it does not look top heavy, heavier on one side than the other, leaning too far forward or too far backward.

Balance is visual weight and not actual weight. The correct placement of main stems forming design or pattern will give structural balance. Visual weight is achieved by the proper use of color and placement in sequence of related sizes of material in conjunction with structural balance. e.g. smaller flower at top grading to largest flower at focal point. Good proportion is essential for good balance. Texture can effect balance, remember rough textures look heavier than smooth textures, also color; dark colors look heavier than light colors.
