### SEPTEMBER DAYTIME MEETING

(Due to Show results etc. this did not get printed last month.) After welcoming those present it was over to Rosalie Moore to speak on Paphiopedilums or Slipper Orchids, as they are commonly called.

The first Paphiopedilum or Cypripedium, as they were then called, was imported into the English orchid scene in 1819. That species was venustrum. Since then many thousands of hybrids have been made.

Rosalie was able to show examples from among the many plants she had bought with her.

For Judging purposes Paphiopedilums usually fall into three classes -

- 1. species e.g insigne, villosum sukhakulii etc.
- novelties e.g Leeanum,
   Meon etc.
- 3. standards e.g Winston Churchill etc.

It was very interesting to see 'mother', 'father', and 'offspring' and note which features had been passed on from each parent to the 'offspring'.

Different conditions are needed for different species, varying from growing among the cymbidiums to controlled glasshouse. Paphiopedilum insigne, venustrum. villosum and spicerianum are among the ones that will tolerate cool conditions.

Hybrids and plain green leaf varieties seem to be a little more tolerant than the mottled leaved paphs which often need the controlled glasshouse conditions. Paphiopedilums have no pseudobulbs to store water so require a growing medium that retains some moisture but does

not keep the plant wet. This is usually obtained by using a fine bark mix, in a small pot.

A weekly water is often sufficient, however, in very hot summer conditions more frequency is required plus a higher humidity. In cold wet weather weekly may be too often.

Some of the small dwarf species are not the most robust growers and not recommended for beginners.

Rosalie then showed some spectacular slides.

From the benched display Rosalie's first choice was Joyce Merritt's beautiful xdelicatum as was that of the members. Other plants to 'poll' well were Harry and Berna Viney's Cymbidium Dr Baker x Tropic Night and Helen Edwards Cattleya intermedia hybrid.

The afternoon concluded with a good look at all the Paphiopedilums on display (as well as the benched orchids of course) and a chat and a cuppa.

#### OCTOBER DAYTIME CHAPTER

It was good to have Keith Northcote back again to welcome members and visitors to the October meeting. Helen Edwards was visiting Honolulu to attend an Orchid Show - we hope to hear all about the visit at the next meeting.

equal top votes, followed closely by C. Lynn Spencer 'Pearl' (K. H. Northcote) Paphiopedilum Via Prokulli (P.& G. Flavel) Dendrobium Yoki Darumi 'King' (H. & B. Viney) and Norm Gitsham's yellow Cymbidium.

The raffle prizes were also a mixed variety. Keith was then invited to cut the special cake to celebrate the 7th anniversary of the Daytime Chapter and this was enjoyed with a cuppa and chat by those present.
