NOTES FROM IRIS HUTCHENS

As these will be the last Floral Art notes for this year I will endeavour to convey to you the meaning of the two remaining principles which have not been covered in this years S.C.O.C. Gazettes, namely

DOMINANCE

Dominance or emphasis adds distinction to an arrangement. One space, one line, one form, one pattern, one texture, one colour etc., involved in an arrangement should dominate over the other portion of same. e.g. One line, as compared with the other lines must dominate.

By emphasizing more of one thing and the subordination of others, competition is removed and unity is made possible. If all are of equal value, or two striving for importance, it is not a successful arrangement. In Floral Art dominant means eye catching, something strong and outstanding. The dominant part of an arrangement is usually the focal area such as abstract arrangements etc.

CONTRAST

Contrast in flower arranging makes for an interesting and exciting arrangement, for without the contrast of light and dark colors, smooth and rough or dull and shiny textures, differing forms, straight or curved lines etc., would appear dull and lifeless.
