Epic. Raniferum

This species has canes to about 600 mm and flowers from the tip of the cane and on my plants will flower successively from this point.

The flower spike emerges then droops as the 10 to 20, 25—30 mm flowers emerge.

I grow my plant in a 9 inch pot near the roof of the Cattleya House. I seems to like light and also prefers more heat.

Plants of this species have been recorded from Mexico to Brazil & Bolivia.



Tip for the Month

If you only have a few plants and need to make up fertilizer in small quantities. Then make up a larger concentrated solution and store it away in an air tight container, then draw off only what you need to make up the quantity for your plants.

Short note on Sigrid Grote our September Speaker

Sigrid started in 1965 growing a Miltonias / Phalaenopsis hybrid on a window sill.

In 1969 got her first glasshouse.

1967 she joined the German Orchid Society

1975 to 1984 Sigrid & her husband served as judges for that Society and he took all photographs of awarded plants.

Sigrid has traveled extensively to many orchid shows and conferences around the world and particularly to the BOC conferences in England and shows in Shah Alam and Durban

To start the night she will talk and show slides on German Native Species Orchids and finish on Species Paphiopedilums.

This is going to be a very interesting and informative talk and should not be missed. We rarely see speakers from overseas at our Club.

Paphiopedilum godefroyae

Found in Thailand: Birds nest Is., east of Isthmus of Kra.

A small growing plant with foliage similar to *P. bellatulum*. It grows on limestone cliffs at an altitude of only 35 metres, where it receives almost full sunlight.

Leaves are 8 to 12 cm long and 3 to 4 cm wide, .

The flower stem can be 3 to 8 cm long, pale green with purple spotting.

Petals are almost circular, slightly cupped, same colour and markings as the dorsal sepal.

It has flowered for me in spring and summer under intermediate conditions.

Woodwardara Beverley Lou 'Blood Shot' (Zcx. Elfin Jade 'Freckles' x Zga. Dynamo 'Splashes') Brand new genera first flowering & displayed at our August cultural meeting. Plant consisted of 3 green bulbs and 3 new growths. The largest growth carried 2 flower spikes with a total of 6 blooms of 7.5 cm width with a colour of rich burgundy red that was solid in the centre and the outer limits the colour formed bold stripes. Lip was white with predominate purple stripes. This had a very different perfume to most Zygopetalums.
