Exhibitors Show Rules

As published in the April 1991 Issue of the Gazette.

Show Prize Schedule

As published in the April 1991 issue of the Gazette except that, in addition, certificates will be awarded for the best display in each of the Open, First and Second Divisions.

Please note that first and second place certificates will be awarded in each category of the Show Prize Schedule, but NO money prizes will be available for this year (1991)

Specimen Cymbidium

It is expected that a plant to be considered as a specimen shall carry at least five flower spikes.

Seedling

A seedling orchid is one that is flowering for the first time. The status of seedling is retained for the flowering season in which it first flowered. There is no minimum flower count. Judging will be on flower quality.

Staking Cymbidium Spikes

To be eligible for judging, Cymbidium spikes should not be tied above the bottom flower on the spike. However, for this, 1991 Spring Show only, one (1) extra tie, will be permitted, placed at the growers' discretion elsewhere along the length of the spike. (Please note that judges may untie this extra tie to test the strength of the spike, should they deem this necessary).

The question of staking and tying Cymbidium spikes will be under continueing review by the Committee of the Club.

SOME USEFUL TIPS by D. Bloomfield Orchid enthusiasts are always seeking new ways and ideas that they hope will improve their particular expertize. Here are a few ideas and tips that you might find helpful.

Most people (well those using glass flasks), take a flask of orchids, roll it up in newspaper and whack it with a hammer, which is a waste of flasks in my opinion.

The easiest way is to warm the base of the flask, by standing in warm water until the agar is soft enough to release its hold on the roots without stripping off the velamin (the white spongy coating) The babies are now removed by holding the flask at a angle under running tepid water and using a sterilized tool i.e hooked wire or forceps to gently eaze the plants out.

Do not wash off all the agar from the roots, as you will deprive the plantlet of all nutrients it needs to sustain it in its new growing medium. (You don't wean a baby & then send it down the road for a Big Mac.)

Hold the plantlets by the roots and dip foliage into a new product called 'Envy' and allow 10 - 15 minutes to dry.

My favourite potting mix for the plantlets is:

5 parts fine bark 1 part charcoal

1 part polystyrene balls

1/2 part rice hulls

in the bottom of the pot and sphagnum moss on the top half. The potting mix should be soaked in water containing liquid fertilizer and Formula 20 (root hormone). continued page 7

DENDROBIUM teretifolium grown by M.J Cunningham
This species occurs naturally from southern New South Wales to northern
Queensland. It grows mostly in casuarina trees & most prolifically along
river banks. It is difficult to grow in containers but survives quite
happily in cultivation on a piece of wood. When in bloom a large plant
of this species is a sight to behold and our flower of the month was no
exception.

If Formula 20 is unavailable a suitable substitute can be made from the following:

1 full teaspoon of Vegemite

l litre of rain or boiled water

1.3 mils of I.A.A. Indole Acetic Acid

1.3 mils of N.A.A. Napthalene Acetic Acid

Shake well and store in airtight container away from sunlight.

'Envy' is a unique water-based hydrophylic polymer that has a built in U.V. filter and is so able to reduce moisture loss from plants by as much as 60%. The one application of 'Envy' should last most of the growing season and will/can increase growth by as much as 25%. Because 'Envy' is water based and not solvent based, it does not cause chemical injury to plants, also, it pours and mixes without having to keep agitating and will not clog sprayers.

It is important to remember not to spray or dip the roots as it could curtail nutrient uptake by the roots, because as its main function is to stop water loss through the leaves, it also tends to inhibit maximum water/nutrient uptake by the roots.

'Envy' is also non-toxic and non-flammable and when applied to top and bottom leaves, it still allows the plant to respire or 'breathe' (that is, pass oxygen, carbon dioxide and ethylene gas through the stomates) while effectively slowing the rate of water loss.

(For the people who were at the August cultural meeting this is the product that Darcy recommended for 'Charlie's Botrytis' or black spot on Cattleya flowers. It acts as a Fungal preventative. Due to the coating it puts on the plants it acts as a barrier to stop spores spreading. It can also be used to extend the life of Cut Flowers.)

If you are interested in either of the above products President (Neil) or Editor (Helen on 2986689) as neither product is easily available in S.A.
