An orchid not often seen exhibited, was on the Open Division bench at our November Cultural meeting. A plant of Rhinershiza divitiflosa grown by John McGrath created some interest.

Two pendulous spikes of long and spidery flowers were fully open, and were pale green in colour, with bright orange-red spotting on the petals.

Rhinerrhiza divitiflora is a genus similar to Sarcochilus, and in fact was at one time included in that genus. It will grow int a very large plant, and has long, rough, raspy roots, in fact the common name for this orchid is 'Raspy-root'.

Plants are normally grown as epiphytes, but when grown in pots in cultivation will send roots to hang outside the pot. They flower freely each year, the buds remaining quite small until a few days before flowering, when the progress is rapid, the flowers open simultaneously and rarely last longer than one day. The grower is extremelylucky if the day of flowering coincides with a Cultural Meeting.

The genus well in bark, and enjoys the same conditions as other Australian epiphytes in the shadehouse.

We thank John for the oportunity to see this unusual Australian epiphytic orchid.

In accordance with the Constitution of the South Coast Orchid Club of South Australia Incorporated, Clause 26, notice is hereby given that it is the intention of the Committee to present the following amendment to the Club's Constitution to the Members for their vote to be cast at the February 1988 meeting of the Club.

Members are asked to collect their ballot papers from the issuing officer and to place the completed paper in the box provided.

(Honorary Members and Junior Members are not eligible to vote.)

The following to be deleted from and added to the end of Clause 11(a) of the Constitution of the South Coast Orchid Club of South Australia Incorporated:-

<u>Delete-</u> Second line the words 'ex officio'

Add at the end of Clause 11(a) -

'The Immediate Past President shall be a Member of the Management Committee and entitled to full voting rights until such time as he ceases to become the Immediate Past President, or until the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting after first becoming Immediate Past President, which ever of these events be the earlier.'

These alterations are recommended to you for your consideration by your Committee, to make these alterations will ensure that our Constitution remains in line with that of the Orchid Club of South Australia Inc. on whose constitution ours' is based, as this alteration was passed by its members at their November meeting.
