**Daytime Report**

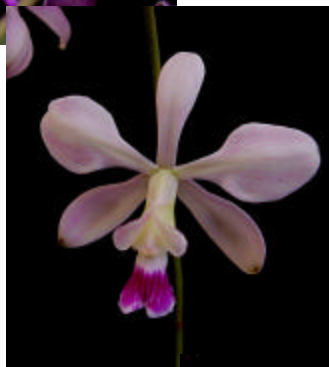

## From the Registrar

The year of change is now behind us and we can now settle down in our new meeting location and look forward to a good year with plenty of good flowers on the bench.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the club judges for their work during last year. I think they are doing a very good job on the plant commentaries but if you don't think so please let me know and tell me what you would like to hear from the judges in the commentary. I hope this year to put a little more emphasis on culture in commentaries, so if your plant is selected for commentary you may be asked about how you grow it.

I would also like to thank Sylvester Ng for recording the aggregate points for me. It helps me a great deal at this time of the year when all the prizes and promotions have to be worked out. I would also like to thank Ron Parish for his work on the prize cards at the meetings.

At the January committee meeting, I raised that I had been giving some consideration to implementing the new recommendations from the AOC (Australian Orchid Council) in relation to Laeliinae classes. Currently it is necessary for Cattleya plus any combination of Brassavola, Laelia, or Sophronitis to be in the background of any of the Laeliinae hybrids while those Laeliinae hybrids which don't have these combinations in their breeding are shown as Laeliinae Other Hybrid irrespective of their size, shape or flowering habit.

The committee recommended that we follow the AOC recommendation and **drop** the requirement to have Cattleya, Brassavola, Laelia, Sophronitis combination in their breeding. I will have new labels made for this in time for the February meeting. It is not an easy change to put in words so if you need further explanation please speak to one of the judges.

## December Floral Competition – Flower of Divisions Flower of the Night and of Open Division

### Cym. Little Beauty 'Super Sparks' grown by Helmuth Herrmann

I think Helmuth deserved a prize just for getting this to the meeting as it was a very large plant in a large (12inch I think) pot. It had 20 pendulous inflorescences between 600 and 900 MM longnically displayed clear of the large psuedo bulbs and leaves. The sepals and petals were deep purple brown, with a narrow margin of cream around the edgesand the lip was deep velvety burgundy

### First Division

#### Phrag Grande 'Chinaman' grown by Gerald & Mina Voskamp

This healthy well grown plant had 3 fully open, 1 partly open flowers and 1 bud on 2, 450mm, stems. The flowers had long thin purple petals as one expects on this hybrid. The sepals were pale green lined with paleish purple and the pouch was veined purple over pale green.

### Second Division

#### Lyc. *aromatica* grown by Terry Rees

Lyc. *Aromatica* has a beautiful perfume to go with the somewhat delicate flowers. There were 20 short stemmed flowers on 6 growths. The flowers had yellow petals and labellum while the sepals were a pale green yellow.

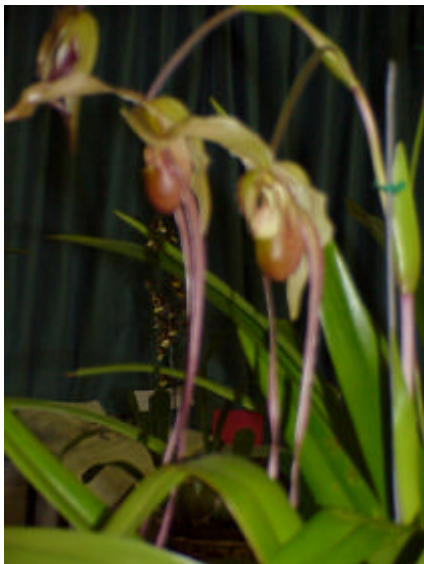

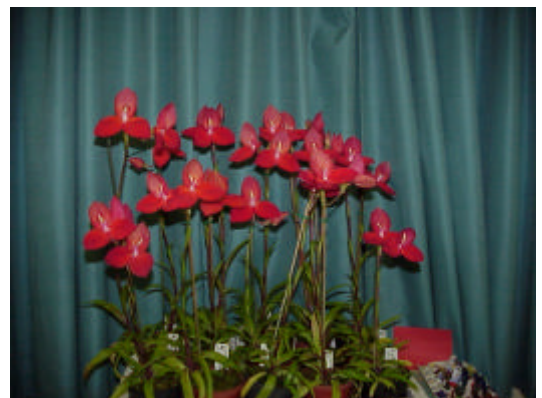
