ARRANGEMENT TO BE DEMONSTRATED

Division 1 Modern = L Shape Open Winter Wonderland

For work in class, Division 1 girls bring materials suitable for a Modern L Shape arrangement and Open girls bring materials suitable for interpreting a Winter Wonderland

arrangement.

Here are a few notes which may help you with your Winter Wonderland arrangement. As the first word is Winter this must must play an important part in your selection of materials. Think of the word and see what it conjures up in your mind --bare trees, (before they burst into bud for Spring), rain snow, cold etc., The next word wonderland, using your imaginationagain, what does it mean to you -- bright dancing lights (rythm) glowing colours etc. Now putting the two together see what you can come up withthe scopeis endless; for example dried branches, stems, or grey driftwood, with or without a touch of white and glitter for snow as a background and using your orchids to get the glowing colors etc. Mobiles could also be used to great advantage in this type of arrangement. For the Division 1 girls--Modern L Shape For this arrangement a low container, either oval or rectangle in shape is the most suitable type to use. For your material you will want some straight stems or foliage etc. to form the L shape and a few flowers grading from small to larger in size. See that the smallest flower has the longest stem. Dont forget a good needle aid and some plasticine. Needle aids may be obtained from the Club AT ALL MEETINGS FOR THE PURPOSES OF INSTRUCTION IN BASIC LINES, PRINCIPLES AND GROUND WORK, ANY MATERIAL AVAILABLE TO MEMBERS CONSISTENT WITH THE NEEDS OF THE INSTRUCTOR WILL BE USED. IN CLUB COMPETITION ONLY ORCHIDS WILL BE USED. MEMBERS WILL BE BRINGING AND DOING.
