Chris's 'small plant and small flower' stole a march on the plants owned and presented by some other Club Members at a cultural meeting held earlier in the year and which quite definitely exhibited considerable greater growth habit. It will be interesting to note the characteristics of subsequent plants when they come into flower.

RHYTHM

Rhythm is a feeling of motion as the eye glides easily through the design it is a feeling we try to achieve in all designing for it gives life to an arrangement. Line, form, texture and color have a strong bearing on rhythm. In modern arrangements it is essential to have a good clean line, with ALL materials following that line to get a good rhythm. Rhythm may also be achieved by the repeated use of similar forms, color, line, etc., but watching gradation, that is, a gradual change from lighter or smaller forms at the top for modern arrangements, and at the outside for massed arrangements. to heavier or larger forms at the focal area.

Color is important too, see that the eye is not stopped by a jarring note in the color harmony as it glides through thearrangement. This also applies to textures, they must be compatable one with the other. Remember the eye glides easily over smooth surfaces but is held by rough textures, and rough textures look heavier than smooth textures. Pay special attention to the placement of leaves, see that they are placed so that they follow the line of the arrangement; also bring some material over the lip of the container so that the container becomes part of the arrangement and does not break the rhythm of the arrangement as a whole. As with music, there are different types of rhythm in floral art and your background material will usually dictate the rhythm. Repetition of straight background material could be likened to a march, whereas very curved and curling material to a waltz, but no matter what type of rhythm your arrangement may depict, the eye must be able to glide easily through the design without any discords.
