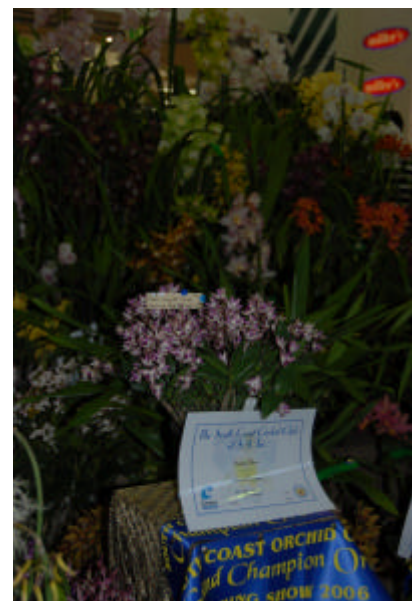

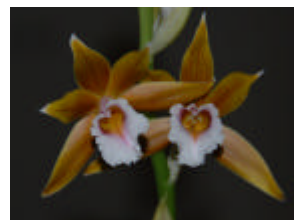
SPECIES GROUP

20 club members met at the usual place in Dover Gardens on a lovely balmy evening on 18th September where they were treated to a charming array of orchid species.

One that immediately caught the eye was the Australian species *Phaius bernaysii*. A tall leafy plant with one erect spike carrying two open sulphur yellow flowers and another six buds. We do not see species from this genus very often and when we do it is the more common *Phaius tankervilleae*.

There are about 50 species in the genus distributed throughout Asia, Africa and New Guinea, there are 4 species found in Australia 3 of which are endemic to Australia (i.e. found only on this continent, *P.tankervilleae* being the exception).

Phaius bernaysii natural habitat is quite small being restricted to swampy areas on the islands of Morton Bay in southeast Queensland. They are terrestrial in nature and to grow them successfully in South Australia they require to be potted in a soil based, open free draining compost. They do need protection during the winter months with a minimum temperature of 10c and the large fleshy leaves easily burn if protection from direct sun is not provided. It is a vigorously growing plant and responds well to regular fertilising.



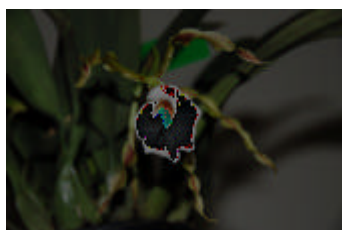
Phaius bernaysii

Another Australian species brought in, this one without a nametag, provoked quite a lot of discussion. It was one of the 'rats tail, Dockrillia's. It was a large straggly terete leaved plant growing very healthily on a mount of natural cork. At the ends of the leaves one or two creamy coloured flowers with purple striping on the segments and a pointed labellum that curled under at the distal end were produced. It was decided after much reference that it was *Dock schoenium*. The reason for the discussion was that this complex of rat tailed dockrillia's have been looked at in detail by the taxonomists and names that we were familiar with have been changed. The species *Dock schoenium* was previously known as *Dock becklerii* which it now replaces.

Two fascinating small species of Dendrobium were benched both had distichous leaves (arranged in two rows) one was *Den keithii* producing single 15mm wide light green flowers from between the fleshy, flattened leaves. The second species was *Den nathanielis*, similar growth habit to the previous one but smaller in all parts. Tiny green flowers 5mm across were produced in quite large numbers from the distal ends of the leafy stems. Although requiring a magnifying glass to fully appreciate the beauty of these little flowers the observer is rewarded by their simple prettiness.

Other plants benched were a pot of *Maxillaria picta* attractive yellow flowers, the hairy *Paphiopedilum hirsutissimum* & the varnished *Paph villosum*, *Dockrillia linguiforme* & *Dock striolata*. One of the Indian Dendrobium the yellow, *Den aggregatum*, A really good specimen of *Zygopetalum crinitum*. The fishing rod orchid *Dendrochilum filliforme*. *Trichopilia tortilis* superficially resembling a Cattleya but with, as the

name suggests, tortuous twisted petals and sepals. Completing the collection was one of the smaller species of a reed stem epidendrum; *Epidendrum elongatum* carrying a small head of lilac coloured flowers.

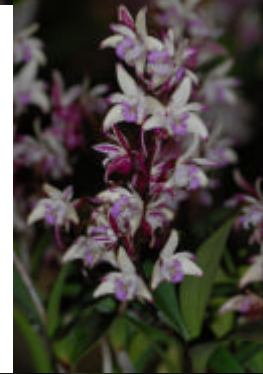
Flower of First Division and Flower of the Night:

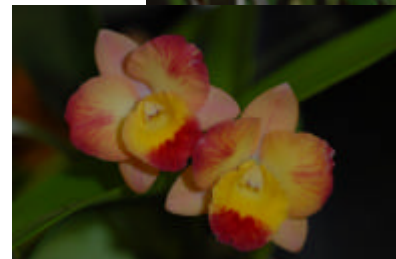
Flower of Open Division:

Den. (Victorian Stripe x Victoria Flair) grown by Ron and Irene Parish. The plant carried some 17 inflorescences with well displayed flowers, the sepals and petals of which had heavy maroon markings on their reverse. The front of the sepals and petals was white tinged with a small amount of red striping at their tips. The labellum was pinkish white at the base with heavy purple-pink shading on the mid-lobe and the insides of the side-lobes.



Flower of Second Division:

Sc. Dal's Good One 'Janelle' grown by Anne and Colin Campbell. The medium sized plant carried two inflorescences of three and two flowers and was sharing its small pot with a small elkhorn. The flowers were 45mm to 50mm in diameter, the sepals were a pale salmon-pink and the petals were yellow at their base with red flaring or feathering towards their tips. The labellum complemented the rest of the flower, being yellow with a deep red patch on the mid-lobe.

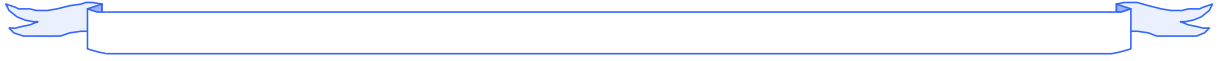
