HELPFUL HINTS

When fertilizing your orchids it is a good idea to rectify the PH balance of the potting medium with the addition of 1 ml of phosphoric acid to every 2 litres of your fertilizer mix. This also helps to feed the orchids with readily available phosphorus and will balance out the effects of Adelaide's slightly alkaline water. Keep adjusting the twisties on the flower spikes as they lengthen and sort out the pots that need extra shade (pastels, whites and greens) Miniature and novelty cymms should need little or no staking. With strong colours once the flowers have set place in shade to prevent fading of the blooms.

## NOTES ON ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE SPRING SHOW.

As there is an Interpretive class in both divisions, namely 'Interpreting a 1st Birthday' in Division 1 and a 'Composition in a niche Interpreting a 1st Birthday' in the Open Division, let us study the meaning of the word 'interpret'. This simply means interpreting a mood, a feeling, a thought, an idea etc or as applicable in this case an occasion. Now, using your imagination think what a 1st Birthday means to you and what it conjures up in your mind, select your materials and design the arrangement to portray your thoughts.

A Composition - In a composition, the two terms 'composition' and 'harmony' are closely related to form a good overall picture. Composition is the grouping of various parts to make the design. All units must be so related that the eye sees them as a whole or flows smoothly from one unit to another. Harmony; this exists when the various units of a composition do not conflict but form a concordant whole. Good composition will not rescue an arrangement whose parts are not in harmony.
