Virus or not virus.

In my opinion when invited to inspect orchids for virus in Autumn shows this month for both Gawler and South Coast, there was no plants suspected of virus.

This may not have been the case in some clubs some five or more years ago.

I believe that through opportunities to better advise orchid growers about virus, the reduction of plants benched with suspect leaves and flowers is evident.

(Don't forget the offer to purchase your copy of a video or DVD on orchid virus from the club.)

At the South Coast Orchid Club's Autumn Show, a Paph. was benched with obvious colour breaks. Colour breaks in orchids can be caused by either certain cultural aspects, genetics or a virus.

In my opinion, from my experience, the colour breaks on the Paph. were genetic.

A sample leaf will be tested by an electron microscope, (a true test for virus) and I will be interested in the outcome.

Members should be aware that the Judge's decision on these matters should be accepted as final.

There is no way that a plant suspected of virus will be allowed on a bench where it can transfer it's 'sickness', on to other healthy orchid plants.

South Coast Species Group

Species Group Meeting May 2003



Barkeriana lindleyana

Around 20 species were on show at this meeting. The Paphiopedilums were well represented with *P. affine*, *spicerianum*, *charlesworthii*, *concolor hennisianum* and *dianthum* on display. *P. affine*, with its long, narrow, erect green leaves spotted on the underside and single flowers in brown and pink points to its close relationship with *P. villosum*.

Aeranthes grandiflora, the Madagascan beauty has large creamy white sequential flowers on long peduncles. It should be a candidate for the shady intermediate house. The "Cats" were on the prowl with a large plant of *C. bowringiana* "Purple King" taking centre stage. The many heads of five or six bright magenta

flowers were a real head turner. This species has a reputation of disliking being divided, often taking years to re-establish. Maybe some clones are more sensitive than others. *Barkeria lindleyana* alba, *Cat. leopoldii* and *Laelia xanthina* were also presented.

The *Oncidium* alliance was represented by a very vigorous plant of *L. bictonense* or was it *L. uro-skinneri*?. *Miltonia spectabilis morelliana* sported its large purple fragrant flowers.



Coelogyne mooreana "Brockhurst"

Coelogyne mooreana "brockhurst" put in an appearance as well as the Ausie favourite, *Dockrillia schoenina* (syn *Dendrobium beckleri*) proved its not bound by seasonal conventions.

In the face of all this colour and flamboyant form, the diminutive *Stenoglottis fimbriata* was voted the favourite. This easygoing terrestrial will take minimum care in Adelaide and reward the grower with spikes of pink spotted flowers above attractively spotted leaves.

**Best, First Division: C. Portiata x C. labiata****Growers: Peter and Shirley French**

This was a large plant with some 28 growths which carried four inflorescences. There were 11 open flowers, five were partially open and there were several unopened buds. Flower size was 118mm high x 125mm wide. Sepals and petals were deep lavender, three lobed labellum was frilled around the deep purple centre lobe. The side lobes were the same colour as the petals and sepal and curved up over the column almost covering it.

**Best, Second Division: C. Blue Boy****Grower: Dorothy Carassi**

One inflorescence on a small well grown plant of five growths, each one larger than the previous one, and growing in medium grade bark. There were two well shaped flowers 80mm high x 84mm wide on the inflorescence. Petals and sepals were pale lavender as were the side lobes of the labellum which curved up around the column almost covering it. The centre lobe of the labellum was deep purple, frilled around the edge and had yellow shading towards its base.

No of Aggregate Points Awarded: The No of points given to the grower in the particular class and counting towards the Aggregate points competition. 1st place 3 points; 2nd place 2 points; and 3rd place 1 point. The entries in a particular class are listed in reverse order i.e. 3rd place is on the top then 2nd and lastly 1st.

From The Registrar

At the May meeting I commented that the quality of the preparation of the plants on the bench had improved over recent months which is good. You expend a lot of time and effort growing your plants and so waste that effort by not displaying your plants to their best advantage.

Leaves should be cleaned and dead or burnt tips neatly cut off. For cleaning leaves a mixture of milk and water roughly 50-50 does a very good job and gives a pleasing dull gloss to the leaves. It is also natural. Dead husks should also be removed or trimmed neatly and back bulbs on Cymbiums (in particular) cleaned up. Any stakes and ties used to support inflorescences should be as unobtrusive as possible.

Now that we have the plant looking good we should consider the pot. If this is dirty with calcium deposits around the base and cobwebs around the lip it will detract from the plant. Wipe the pot clean and remove the white calcium deposits. An alternative here is to use a decorative container to cover the pot. To put a final finishing touch you could cover the bark around the pseudo bulbs with some Spanish Moss.

In future the judges will be paying more attention to plant preparation when judging and may downgrade plants which display inadequate preparation.

I hope those of you who will be displaying plants in the SAROC fair will spend some time on preparation which will play a big part in this open competition. I hope we will have lots of plants with plenty of colour. We also need foliage plants as these contribute very much to the overall look of the display. Would people bringing plants please bring a list of the plant names that they are exhibiting to make it easier to write the labels. You do not have to write your own labels as these need to be uniform and will be written by one person at put in time. This list should be given to Jane, Don or Lesley when you arrive.
