On the Bench at the September Meeting, Judged for the Spring Show.

Congratulations to all who benched plants, a good range and quality was benched. Cymbidiums dominated across the Divisions which is typical for this season.

Show Grand Champion and Champion of Open Division:

Phalaenopsis White Dream shown by Heather and Richard Fishlock. This plant carried a single arching inflorescence with seven open flowers and three buds. The well filled flowers were arranged in two rows along the stem. The sepals and petals were white and highlighted by a white labellum shaded with yellow plus red lines and spotting towards its base.

Champion of First Division:

A ***Cym. Sarah Jean hybrid*** shown by Merv. and Shirley Steele

Champion of Second Division:

Cym Anna Szabo 'Geyserland' shown by Denis Cook

A few plants in the individual Divisions:

Open Division:

Paph. (Dorary x Galahad), a first flowering seedling, was benched by Geraldine and Peter Flavel. It is a crossing of two parents first registered in the early 1960's. Both sepals were pale green in colour heavily spotted in crimson, the dorsal also edged in white. The petals were deep brownish red with the ends edged in green, the pouch heavily veined in brownish red and edged in green. This hybrid was registered in 1998 as *Paph.* Carey Gully.



A very attractive large plant of the Australian species, *Den. kingianum* 'Clara', with 32 inflorescences of very deep purple-red flowers was shown by Helmut and Ursula Herrmann. Many of the spikes had all flowers, which were 18mm wide and 16mm high, fully open. Others had some or all still in bud but the display was still very good. Such deep colour would have resulted from selective line breeding.

The non-standard Phalaenopsis, *Phal.* Hsin Sunflower, benched by Heather and Richard Fishlock carried three inflorescences of yellow flowers. One spike had 5 open flowers and one bud (sufficient for it to be judged). The other two, one of which was branched, had some flowers open. The flowers had yellow sepals and petals very lightly spotted with pale orange-red and the yellow labellum had orange-red markings and white on its tip.

Amongst the many well grown Cymbidiums that were benched in this division two that caught the eye were *Cym.* Kurralta Park 'Tennyson' grown by Geoff and Lucy Spear and *Cym.* (Dryad x *devonianum*) registered in 2002 as *Cym.* Dry Devon and grown by Hank and Erna Van Leuven. The *Cym.* Kurralta Park carried five inflorescences with 12, 8, 8, 8 and 7 flowers over 90mm across. Their sepals and petals were deep pink complemented by a cream labellum with dark red barring and spotting and a fine white edge. The other *Cym.* with 11 inflorescences carrying between 10 and 26 flowers, were spread around the plant and arching down over the pot. The very attractive small flowers

had pale greenish cream sepals and petals spotted and lined with crimson set off by the cream labellum heavily spotted in crimson.

First Division

Den. Elegant Heart is one of the so called Australian native "hot/cold" hybrids with *Den.* Peewee [*Den.* (biggibum x tetragonum)] and *Den. speciosum* as its parents. The sepals and petals of the

flowers were pale greenish cream with the petals lightly shaded with pink. The narrow pointed labellum was veined and shaded in deep purple pink. The plant was grown by David Camack.

Another native hybrid benched was a 1st flowering seedling *Den. Tyabb* grown by Suzanne Willcox. It carried one inflorescence with six flowers of creamish white sepals and petals edged and shaded with light purplish pink complemented by a striking solid deep purple labellum.

Paphiopedilum Ceres, a primary hybrid between *Paph. hirsutissimum* and *Paph. spicerianum*, first registered in 1891, carried five flowers and was shown by Terri Rees. The dorsal sepals were creamish-white spotted and shaded with red and solid red at their base. Their dorsal sepals were green. The petals were spotted brownish red and were frilled along their upper edge, a trait seen in both parents, and were also twisted towards their ends. The labellums had dark brown markings on a green base.

Cym. (Red Beauty x Elegant Valerie) carrying 6 inflorescences with between six and nine flowers was grown by Silvester Ng. The sepals and petals were heavily striped and marked with deep pink on a cream base. The cream labellum had heavy crimson markings with a white edge and spotting on the side lobes and towards the centre of the flower.

Second Division

Hazel and Des Alsop benched a mature plant of the Australian native species *Den. gracicaule*. It had numerous spikes carrying tiny yellow flowers about 10mm across. Their labellums were faintly marked with red and the backs of the sepals were heavily spotted with deep red.

Cym. Jubilation 'Geronimo', benched by Denis Cook, had three inflorescences carrying 22, 11 and seven flowers which were greater than 90mm across. The sepals and petals were a clear strong yellow, the labellum paler yellow with heavy red markings and edged with light orange.

Denis Cook also benched *Cym.* Anna Szabo 'Geyserland' in the 60 to 90mm size category. The sepals and petals of its predominantly white flowers were lightly shaded with pink and the white labellum was spotted with deep crimson and a red midline over pale yellow at its centre.

A plant belonging to the *Laeliinae* benched by Wendy Lodge was *Slc.* California Apricot x *C.* Horace. The attractive open flower had yellow sepals, petals and labellum. The labellum had a large purple blotched on the outer half and the yellow side lobes folded up over the column.

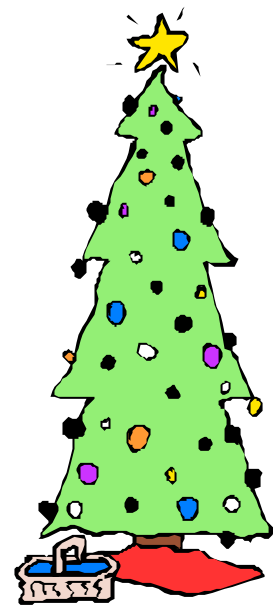

At the South Coast Orchid Club Species Group 18 members met at the regular monthly meeting in the club hall at Dover Gardens on Monday 5th of September.

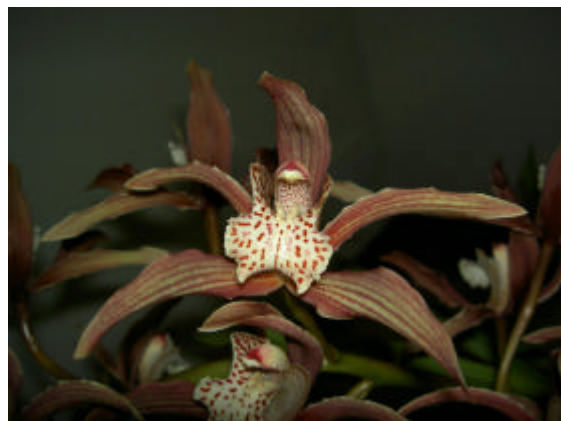
