Presidents Report for the Month of April 2002

We have a new motto for our Club

The year 2002 is moving along at a very fast rate it seems only weeks ago we were wondering whether our Cyms would spike this year, our Cattleya's would produce and likewise our bulbs would flower.

Already we are seeing many of these genera appearing on our benches at Club meetings. This month an exceptional array of plants were benched from a showy Cattleya's to Cyms and Zygosis and Australian Natives etc.

Members are to be commended for plants brought in at our meeting.

Since we made the transition from the South our attendance at meetings has averaged better than 50 people present.

We were certainly brought up to date with labelling information of our plants by our A.O.C. State Delegate Pauline Rankin to whom we are very grateful. I propose to include a copy of Pauline's address in a future magazine. Thank you Pauline.

Show time is fast approaching and I acknowledge the work undertaken by Graham Shevlin, Hank Van Leuvren and Merv Steele in obtaining us show venues in Shopping Centres. Thank you for a job well done.

We return to Colonnades again for the Autumn Show, and with the help and assistance of the Management Staff of the Centre. We are doing things different this time to avoid the cost of hiring security staff at a rate of \$54.45 per hour, which if we average out the normal time to establish our show takes 6 hours or in excess of \$300.00.

The Registrar of Judges and his judging panel have cooperated to set up and judge on Saturday afternoon (details else where in the magazine).

On the subject of shows, they provide to the Club a financial lifetime to keep fees at a moderate amount. A show requires a lot of cooperation to achieve a success, without your plants there is no show, it also provides an outlet to sell your surplus plants to the public. In regard to selling, your Club is reliant on people to assist. Your committee alone cannot do it all. Giving up a couple of hours during the week assists to a great degree, it means you may develop a better understanding of your fellow members, promote your Club to the Public and who knows we may gain some additional members to assist you and your Club.

The 3rd arm of our Club is growing quite well having achieved an increase in Club membership by 13 – 14 people and while its format for meetings is different to the St Mary's and Daytime meetings, it is certainly providing interest to those who attend.

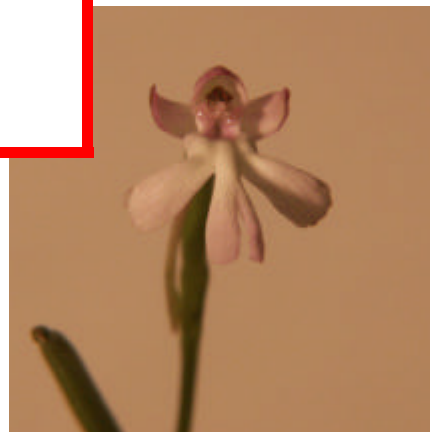
South Coast Species Group

Open Division Flower of the Division: & FLOWER OF THE NIGHT

Rossioglossum grande
grown by Ron & Irene Parish

Tony Bourne in his commentary noted that this was a very good example of this species orchid which occurs naturally in Mexico and Guatemala and is commonly known as the Clown Orchid. This plant was grown in a 130mm pot in a bark and isolite mix and was typical of this beautiful species with the yellow tips to the flower segments, the brown barring of the sepals and solid brown coloration of the petals in the centre of the flower. This is the second month in a row that we have seen this species as the flower of the night but different plants.



First Division Flower of the Division:

Z. Redvale 'Chocolate'

Four inflorescences carrying 14 flowers each measuring 68 x 72mm made this quite a spectacular plant. Jane Higgs commented that the colour of the petals and sepals was a most unusual very pale brown or chocolate with a lovely dark purple lip.



Second Division

Flower of the Division:

Milt. spectabilis var Moreliana

This plant had 5 single flowers measuring 75x 107mm. These flowers were a typical var. moreliana with petals and sepals dark purple and with a striking deep rose pink labellum. The var. moreliana which is native to Brazil, has much darker colouring than the straight *Milt. spectabilis*. The plant was growing in a 10 cm pot.

From the Registrar

I'm looking forward to the Autumn Show and am pleased we are back at Colonnades Shopping Centre again. Graham Shevlin and his team should be thanked for their work to find venues for our shows. As I write this I am not quite certain when we will be putting in and judging, these details will appear elsewhere in the gazette. I am certain however, that if we all pull together we will have a great show and justify the work of Graham's group.

At this time of the year of course the show will be dominated by Laeliinae genera hence the H. & B. Viney trophy for the best Cattleya. Richard and Beryl Wilson have had a monopoly on this trophy since its inception as the Tony De Ionno trophy (which was eventually won by them for winning it 3 years in a row). I wonder if they will continue their winning streak?

At our monthly meetings, we have been limiting the commentary to 3 plants per division although we have been combining First and Second division due to the limited choice especially in Second division. Jane (First & Second) and Tony (Open) did the commentary at the April meeting. Jane chose to comment on Paph. Glaucoapar, a primary hybrid from *Paphs. parishii* and *glaucophyllum*. This was grown by Suzanne Wilcox in a home made self watering pot and had 1 rather attractive flower and a bud. The flower was green with maroony brown striations on the pouch and spotting on the other segments. However, there was some doubt cast as to whether this was in fact Paph. Glaucoapar and it was later decided after some discussion that it was more likely to be Paph Shireen (*Paph glaucophyllum x philippinense*).

Tony selected *Den. lithocola* grown by Noel Oliver and Cym (Arkaroola x Peter Pan) grown by Helmuth Gerber. *Den. lithocola* was formally know as *Den bigibbum* var. *compactum* and has been used in the production of the "hot – cold" hybrids (some call them "tropicools") and to produce a more rounded shape and darker coloration in the progeny. This relatively small plant had 2 racemes of dark pink to purple flowers with the larger raceme carrying 13 flowers. The labellum had a very nice darker coloration on the inner portion. Cym. (Arkaroola x Peter Pan) was also a small plant with a back bulb, a green bulb and a well developed shoot. It had a single upright inflorescence with the 13 flowers displayed well above the foliage and nicely arranged around and along the inflorescence. The flowers were a clear light green on the petals and sepals with a contrasting red colouration on the labellum.

Thanks to Tony and Jane for the use of their notes to write this.
