## **SINGAPORE WORLD ORCHID CONFERENCE** **13<sup>th</sup> – 20<sup>th</sup> NOVEMBER 2011**

A.O.C. have been able to arrange a very satisfactory set of prices through Flight Centre, Modbury for the WOC to be held in Singapore later this year.

The price (\$2228 pp) includes 7 night's accommodation (executive rooms at the Carlton Hotel, Bras Basah Road, next door to Raffles Hotel – breakfast included) together with return airfares Adelaide-Singapore-Adelaide. Private vehicle transfer is also included to and from the airport in Singapore. The Carlton Hotel also provides late checkout on the final day, with baggage hold until departure to the airport. The above quote was at 12/01/11, but I have been advised that Singapore Airlines have reduced this by a significant amount.

I have told this story before, I was a new grower and left the plant I had to show that night on the verandah when I went to work. Drove in the driveway to see the best spike I ever saw fall to the ground (caterpillar.) I have learnt since to put cotton wool around the bottom of the stalk so they can't attack my show plants.

Scale and mealy bug is still around. For scale, follow the instructions on bottle of Maverick plus ecooil. Mealy bug, put metho on cotton bud and dab on the bugs.

Remember not to fertilise while your plants are in bloom, no purpose, start again in November-December and protect your blooms from the elements.

## June Plant Commentary

**Flower of Open Division and Flower of the Night:** *Phal. Salt Lake* benched by Henk and Erna Van Leuveren. The mature plant carried two inflorescences both with five open flowers and four still in bud. Flowers were 105 mm across, 100 mm tall and had good rounded shape, were very flat and there were no gaps between sepals and petals. The sepals and petals were pristine white and were complimented by the white labellum highlighted with yellow and some maroon fine stripes and spotting.



**Flower of First Division:** *Den. Avril's Gold* benched by Pauline and Mark Hockey. The well grown plant bore three inflorescences, two with all well shaped flowers open and the other one still in bud. The flowers' sepals and petals were deep butter yellow, the sepals having deep maroon spotting along their edges. The slightly lighter cream/yellow labellum also was spotted with maroon.



**Flower of Second Division:** *Lyc. Calymea 'Nikki'* benched by Trevor Stutley. The plant produced four inflorescences, two with open flowers and two still in bud. The flowers were 140 mm across and 150 mm tall with sepals of red/brown shading to pale green at the tips. The petals were light crimson at the base on a cream base but predominantly deep cream. The labellum was crimson and the column was green.
