His eyes really light up when describing the thrill of holding a small possum in the palm of his hand, this small marsupial was thought to be just about extinct, the Hairy Nosed Wombat was also in decline and the Red/Black Cockatoo from Kangaroo Island that came to the mainland to breed each year. Unfortunately their food trees were slowly disappearing and the birds' numbers were in decline because of this. Happily the problem was solved and they are now growing again in numbers, a happy and good result. Occasionally some of us at the meeting are lucky enough to have cockatoos flying over our houses, huge black ones with yellow marking on their wings, they are also extremely noisy when calling to each other.



Introduced animals from overseas have played havoc with lots of our native Fauna depleting their numbers quite dramatically. Lots of plants and shrubs are also vulnerable because of these animals, bushfires, floods and weedy garden plants escaping from our home gardens. Now the majority of people are more aware of this and are volunteering to clean up, nurture and replace the inappropriate plants in their home garden. Thanks Malcolm, myself and many others found this all very interesting.

Apologies today from Marie Bravery, Audrey Biebrick, (lovely to see Don again after a long break) and Shirley Gordon. We all hope to see you with us again very soon.

Our display table today had some lovely cattleyas' on display plus a lovely oncidium. Thanks to all for bringing them in for us all to see. Bill Clark's cattleya, a lovely specimen sized Cat. Laelia Anceps 'Hindmarsh', a very showy pale mauve flower with a darker mauve labellum with white markings. The petals slightly wavy with multiple flowers on each spike. Congratulations and well done Bill on winning the popular vote of the day. Geoff did the plant commentary as usual today, thanks Geoff.

For the first time we had a lucky badge draw, this will now be a regular feature.

The meeting was closed after another great day, thanking all in attendance, thanks also to those who helped in the kitchen.

Beginner's Class

On a beautiful Autumn Day in Victor Harbor, President Geoff involved the group in aspects of orchid growing at this time of year. It should be a good flowering season as we have had reasonably mild weather.

We should start seeing indications of spikes and need to keep the watering up ensuring that water gets to the undersides of the leaves as well, to control Spider mite.

Plants should now be fed little and often (at least once a week) with a high nitrogen fertiliser. We were reminded to sterilise cutting tools to avoid virus and other orchid disease.

At the beginners' class next month John Gay will be talking on mixed genera.

Reminiscence

As a new member it was good to talk to Lucy, our Secretary and gain a little insight on how our group started.

The South Coast Orchid Club of SA inc held its Ruby Anniversary (1965-2005) and it was remembered that the club first started in Victor Harbor and then relocated to Adelaide. It was recognised that Victor Harbor's population had grown and Ron Parish, along with Murray Baulderstone, suggested the formation of a new group at Victor Harbor. Lucy and Geoff agreed to explore the founding of the new Group down there.

After a letter drop, the first meeting on 30th January 2005 attracted 35 people and 25 joined the group. Current members, Eileen Pinnock, John and Monika Sorrell, Keith and Russ Sutton were included and at the following meeting Reg Clifford also became a member.

It was agreed that the Main Club would provide support including the President and Secretary and our appreciation must go to Geoff and Lucy and other committee members who have assisted the group since that time.

Meeting opened 2.00 pm.

Geoff welcomed members, and conducted the regular raffles. He read a letter of resignation from Moyna Leedham and thanked her for her past involvement .

Guest speaker next meeting will be Graham Morris, the previous owner of Valley Orchids speaking on mixed genera. John Gay will also give a short talk to advise beginners on divisional tags and their abbreviations.

President Geoff demonstrated a community pot of seedlings and showed how well they grow in seeding bark, peat moss and perlite after being transferred into six inch pots. They then need to be daily watered and fertilised

We watched a potting demonstration and were shown how back bulbs could be potted and were made aware of 'False Spider Mite' and a virus that could badly infect our plants.

March Plant Commentary

Flower of First Division and Flower of the Night:

C. Valentine Day 'Leanne' benched by Malcolm Young. A medium size plant with 5 canes, one bearing an upright inflorescence, with twelve open flowers 65 – 70 mm across. All segments were deep red, the mid-lobe of the outer portion of the labellum being deep mahogany with some yellow towards the centre of the flowers.



Flower of Open Division: *Rth. Dal's Elite 'Anna'* benched by Richard and Beryl Wilson. A well grown plant carrying three inflorescences, one with two open flowers, one with one open flower and a bud and the third with two buds still to open. The flowers were 105 mm across and tall. Petals were lightly ruffled around the edge, pink at the edge shading to lavender pink towards the centre. Sepals were pale pink shading to crème at the centre. The labellum was deeper lavender around the ruffled edge and deep yellow towards the centre.



Flower of Second Division: *Milt. Goodale Moir 'Golden Wonder'* benched by George Misirlis. A well grown specimen with some twenty-three spikes right around the plant making a very good display. Sepals and petals were a strong yellow with light brown patches becoming more prevalent towards the centre of the flower. The contrasting labellum was white shading to purple (with some purple venation) towards the centre of the flower.
