### NOVELTY CLUSTER CATTLEYAS -

Those that cannot conform to our AOC standards for Cluster Cattleyas in shape and size because of their breeding but do conform to the 8 minimum number of flowers.

### COCKTAIL CATTLEYAS -

Those that conform to our AOC standards for shape and colour but cannot gain points for size. It is preferable that the plant also be small and compact.

## ON THE BENCH.

Cymbidium canaliculatum, variously known as the Channel Leaf Cymbidium and the Black Orchid, is one of only three Cymbidiums endemic to Australia. It grows in the Kimberleys, in the Northern parts of Western Australia, in the Northern Territory and from North Eastern Queensland (Cape York) to the Hunter River region in Central New South Wales. The ovoid pseudobulbs bear 2-6 very stiff longitudinally grooved or channelled leaves. Racemes can be 40 cms. long, bearing more than 60 fragrant flowers which are variable in size and colour. Colour ranges from pale green, brown, purple, dull-red, dark reddish-black, and various combinations.

Plants form dense clumps in hollows of trunks and branches of a wide range of eucalypts, the root system penetrates into the decaying heartwood of the tree, and roots and rhizomes can emerge metres away from other hollows. Plants are very hardy, and can endure blazing hot sun. The flowers are fragrant, especially before noon.

Cultivation of Cym. canaliculatum is not always easy. The plants object to disturbance of the root system. Some growers have success growing Cym. canaliculatum in a hollow tree trunk. the hollow filled with decaying leaf matter and large bark chunks. and leaving the plant undisturbed. Plants grow best in a hot inland climate, rather than cool moist coastal areas, they require an abundance of air movement and bright light.

The plant of Cym. canaliculatum exhibited by Betty Wyly on the 1st Division Bench in December, was beautifully grown and presented. The four pendulous spikes of dark red (almost black) flowers were all in perfect condition, making an attractive display.

A dark red, almost black, coloured form of Cym. canaliculatum is known as v. sparkesii and is common in Northern Queensland. It is one of at least seven colour forms given botanical names either as varieties or forms. Another, but rarer colour form, has clear apple green flowers with a white labellum.

The flowers of Cym. canaliculatum along with Cym. madidum and Cym. suave are pollinated by small native bees.

# SOUTH AUSTRALIAN STATE ORCHID CONFERENCE JUNE 1990

- DATE: The Queen's Birthday Holiday Weekend June 9 to 11, 1990.
- PLACE: MOUNT GAMBIER South Australia.
- VENUE: The Southeast College of TAFE Wehl Street campus.

  This venue has been chosen because all the main conference activities can take place in the one location.

  Facilities include a 240 seat Theatre, Student's Common Room for lunches & Orchid Exhibition, and two good sized Classrooms for Commercial Plant Sales areas.
- REGISTRATION:- Registration costs will be \$30 single & \$50 double.

  Included in the registration will be luncheon on the Saturday, Registration package, and access to all Lectures, Exhibition area, and Plant Sales area.
- CONFERENCE DINNER: (optional) Charge \$17-50 per head.

The Dinner venue will be the Commodore Motel - one of the official Conference Motels. This venue can only accommodate 120 diners, so bookings will be made in the order of receipt of Registrations.

The DINNER will be of THREE Courses with choices in all three courses.

It is planned to have an interesting after Dinner Speaker.

- EXHIBITION: It is planned to have an exhibition of Flowering Orchids, and all registrants are invited to bring flowering plants. Provision has been made, in conjunction with the O.C.S.A. to conduct AWARD JUDGING, and appropriate nomination forms will be available at the Exhibition venue.
- SPEAKERS:- A distinguished panel of speakers has been arranged, and there will be at least 9 lecture sessions provided. Subjects and confirmed speakers are as follows.
