PLANT COMPETITION

Preliminary notice is given that the Club will be conducting plant competitions in Cattleya and Zygopetalum genera with the issue of plants in September - details later.

HELPFUL HINTS.

Now that the buds are emerging on the cymbidiums, care must be taken to bring the flowering results to the stage which will catch the judges eye at the Spring Shows. Keep giving plenty of water to flowering cyms and as you place the plant in its flowering position point the spike (or stronger spikes on large plants) to the north. This is also a good time for the plant to receive a sprinkle of Disyston or similar preparation to keep sucking insects away, especially the aphids. Aphids seem particularly attracted to whites, pastel colors and pure colour cyms.

By now you should have ceased watering all deciduous orchids (nobiletype Dendrobiums etc) until new growth is apparent in the Spring time. An occasional overhead spray is the only requirement necessary to keep them progressing.

Notes on this Class

Sweet and Dry: -- This class gives you a very wide scope for both materials and design. If using the 2 container as one you can combine endless types of dried material with orchids which look quite sweet. And using the two containers separately, one arrangement could be a dried arr. and the other just a sweet arrangement.
