## **September Plant Commentary (cont.)**

### **Flower of Second Division and Flower of the Night:**

*Dendrobium speciosum* benched by Vicki Cooper.

Well grown plant with seven cascading inflorescences bearing numerous flowers. Sepals and petals pale yellow/cream. The labellum was the same base colour as other segments and was highlighted with fine lines along both sides of the labellum. The column was capped with a light yellow cap.



### **Flower of First Division:**

*Cym.* Sarah Jean 'Ice Cascade' bench by Rito and Rosetta Silvestri.

A very well grown plant bearing 8 inflorescences cascading down around the pot bearing numerous flowers 55 mm tall x 55 mm wide on each spike with just a few not opened on the ends. Flowers were pristine white with pale yellow along the mid line of the labellums and cream pollen caps.



### **Flower of Open Division:**

*Zga.* Clair Fisher 'Zenja' benched by Kevin Trevan. A small plant with a single inflorescence carrying six open flowers 70 mm tall and wide. Sepals and petals had large brown patches overlaid on the green background. The large showy labellum was vibrant purple on a white background and white edge.

## **Spring Show Plant Commentary**

### **Grand Champion, Champion Open Division and Champion Australian Native**

*Den.* Hilda Poxon shown by Noel Oliver.

A large mature plant with 13 inflorescences with numerous flowers arranged around the stems. Flowers were 75 mm tall by 65 mm wide. Sepals and petals were deep butter yellow while the labellum had deep maroon markings towards the centre of the flower which was the same deep yellow colour.



### **Champion 1st Division and Champion Laellinae**

*Gsl.* Adelaide Ablaze 'Sunburst' shown by Eileen Pinnock.

A very well grown plan with three cans with 14, 20 and 22 flowers clustered above the foliage of each cane. Flowers 60 mm. tall x 55 mm wide. Sepals and petals were deep yellow with red overlays on both sepals and petals towards the outer half, petals more solid than the sepals. The mid-lobe of the labellum was deep red and the yellow side lobes curling up over the yellow column.



### **Champion Second Division**

*Den.* Hewitt Glow benched by Oui Ju and Michael Willoughby.

A large well grown plant with approximately 30 inflorescences in full flower. Sepals and petals were yellow with some very fine spotting near the flower centre. The labellum was light yellow with a small amount of fine red spotting becoming much heavier towards the flower centre. The column was cream with a paler pollen cap.



### **Champion Cymbidium Under 60 mm.**

*Cym.* Ruby Brook 'Falling Fire' benched by Geoff and Lucy Spear.

A large plant with eleven inflorescences cascading down around the pot and stand. The stems carried between eight and nineteen flowers but most between eleven and fourteen flowers each. The flowers were very uniform, 50 mm both tall and wide and were very striking with deep maroon sepals and petals with the petals having a very fine cream edge. The labellum was an even deeper red with a yellow stripe along the centre line. The red column was topped by a pink pollen cap.



## **Spring Show Plant Commentary (cont.)**

### **Champion Cymbidium 60 – 90 mm:**

*Cym.* Gentle Touch 'Bon Bon' benched by Oui Ju and Michael Willoughby

A well grown plant with two inflorescences of 21 and 13 flowers 60 mm tall x 65 mm wide. Sepals and petals solid green with very fine light red line along the mid vein. The labellum was white with heavy large deep maroon spotting around the periphery. The column was green with a white pollen cap.



### **Champion Cymbidium Over 90 mm:**

*Cym.* Kimberley Valley 'Mouliache' shown by Oui Ju and Michael Willoughby.

A plant with a single inflorescence carrying 12 well fill in shapely flowers 80 mm tall and just over 90 mm wide. Sepals and petals were mid to deep green with some light brown shading on the segments. The labellum was frilled around the mid lobe and white with red spotting towards the edge. Pale green column with red marking just behind the white pollen cap.

### **Champion Species:**

*Dendrobium speciosum* var. *speciosum* Brighton' shown by Noel Oliver.

A well grown, large plant with 5 inflorescences mostly with more than 50 flowers approximately 45 mm tall and 32 mm wide. All sepals and petals were light yellow without other markings. The cream labellums were finely spotted with maroon and the column and pollen cap were pale yellow.



### **Champion Oncidiinae:**

*Odm.* Viloetta 'Von Holm' shown by Geoff and Lucy Spear

A relatively small plant carrying three inflorescences, one with 7 open flowers and 3 buds, another with 6 open and four still to open and one in bud. Sepals and petals were deep maroon with small greenish-yellow striping across the segments. The large, showy, flat labellum was purple and darkened towards the flower centre with a yellow calyx in the centre and some dark purple striping. The column was cream at the base with purple markings towards the outer end. The column had a cream pollen cap.

### **Champion Seedling:**

*Cym.* Kimberley Flash shown by Oui Ju and Michael Willoughby

A very attractive flower 80 mm tall and 85 mm wide with cream overlaid pink sepals and petals with a deeper pink line down the vein line of the segments. The segments also paler near the edges of the sepals and petals. The showy labellum was deep red along the mid-lobe with a pale pink outer edge and cream towards the centre with some red spotting. The column was deep pink with light cream pollen cap.



## **Spring Show Plant Commentary (cont.)**

### **Champion Specimen**

*Den.* Victorian Splendour shown by Oui Ju and Michael Willoughby.

A very well grown plant with more than 50 inflorescences mainly with over 5 flowers per stem that were 30 mm tall and wide. Sepals and petals were cream with pink shading on reverse. Deep maroon labellum with some fine cream markings with a white column and pollen cap.

### **Champion Other Genera**

*Angraecum Veitchii* shown by Wendy Lodge

A large well grown primary plant bearing a single inflorescence bearing five flowers 100 mm tall by 110 mm wide. The narrow sepals and petals were light green and the large labellum was white with some pale green shading towards the flower centre. The pale green column was topped with a cream pollen cap. A feature of these flowers was the 130 mm "tail" protruding from the back of the flower.

### **Champion Phalaenopsis**

*Phal.* Unknown shown by Helmet Herrmann

A relatively small but well grown plant with five colourful flat flowers. Sepals deep purple/pink with very fine narrow, white edge and the petals were a similar colour becoming a little paler towards the petal edge. The mid-lobe of the labellum was deep purple. The side lobes were a shade of colour between that of the labellum mid-lobe and the petals and was overlaid with deep pink striations.
