ON THE BENCH

Thomas Lobb was the younger of two brothers who collected plants for James Veitch and Sons, noted English horticulturists in the mid 19th Century. He travelled widely in India, Burma, Java, Malaya, Borneo and the Philippines discovering many new and valuable orchid species. In the early 1850's he found Paphiopedilum villosum in the mountains of Burma, near Moulmein. It was introduced into horticulture by James Veitch in 1853. In 1865 a plant of Paph. villosum was awarded an FCC by the Royal Horticultural Society. Since that time plants of Paph. villosum have gained other awards both in England and America.

Paph. villosum is found growing in tangled masses of decaying vegitation including mosses. Occasionally it is found as an epiphytic on the branches of trees, in the mountainous regions near to the Burma-Assam border at elevations of 1300-1700 metres. Early finds were reported from near Moulmein, Burma, but recent reports were in the mountains of Northwest Thailand on the Thai side of the border.

The species produces leathery, dull green leaves that measure 30--40cm in length, and have a width of $3\frac{1}{2}\text{cm}$. Faint mottling can be observed on the upper surface, and the underside is a lighter green heavily spotted with purple towards the base. The flower scape is very hairy 20--30cm tall, the single flower is of large size $8\frac{1}{2}\text{--}15\text{cm}$ measuring vertically, and may be the largest flower of the genus. The dorsal sepal is erect with a tall narrow appearance, brown-purple basally and centrally the remainder green with a white marginal band. The petals are narrow at their bases gradually widening towards the tips, the base colour is yellowish brown with a broad purple median line which divides the upper and lower halves into lighter and darker areas. The sepals are reticulated with brown, the pouch is yellowish to honey coloured with darker brown reticulations.

The flowers are glossy appearing to be varnished which adds to their beauty. They will remain in perfect condition for 6 weeks or more. The flowering season is in the Winter and early Spring.

Paph. villosum will grow satisfactorily in an unheated glasshouse and grows quickly to specimen size.

A fine specimen plany of Paph. villosum was exhibited by Ron Parish on 1st Division Bench at the July Cultural Meeting. Six glistening flowers were beautifully displayed on a large plant and gained the award as Registrar's Flower of the Month.
