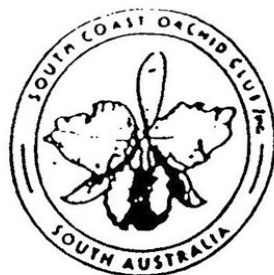

ON THE BENCH

Thomas Lobb was the younger of two brothers who collected plants for James Veitch and Sons, noted English horticulturists in the mid 19th Century. He travelled widely in India, Burma, Java, Malaya, Borneo and the Philippines discovering many new and valuable orchid species. In the early 1850's he found *Paphiopedilum villosum* in the mountains of Burma, near Moulmein. It was introduced into horticulture by James Veitch in 1853. In 1865 a plant of *Paph. villosum* was awarded an FCC by the Royal Horticultural Society. Since that time plants of *Paph. villosum* have gained other awards both in England and America.

*Paph. villosum* is found growing in tangled masses of decaying vegetation including mosses. Occasionally it is found as an epiphytic on the branches of trees, in the mountainous regions near to the Burma-Assam border at elevations of 1300-1700 metres. Early finds were reported from near Moulmein, Burma, but recent reports were in the mountains of Northwest Thailand on the Thai side of the border.

The species produces leathery, dull green leaves that measure 30-40cm in length, and have a width of 3½cm. Faint mottling can be observed on the upper surface, and the underside is a lighter green heavily spotted with purple towards the base. The flower scape is very hairy 20-30cm tall, the single flower is of large size 8½-15cm measuring vertically, and may be the largest flower of the genus. The dorsal sepal is erect with a tall narrow appearance, brown-purple basally and centrally the remainder green with a white marginal band. The petals are narrow at their bases gradually widening towards the tips, the base colour is yellowish brown with a broad purple median line which divides the upper and lower halves into lighter and darker areas. The sepals are reticulated with brown, the pouch is yellowish to honey coloured with darker brown reticulations.

The flowers are glossy appearing to be varnished which adds to their beauty. They will remain in perfect condition for 6 weeks or more. The flowering season is in the Winter and early Spring.

*Paph. villosum* will grow satisfactorily in an unheated glasshouse and grows quickly to specimen size.

A fine specimen plant of *Paph. villosum* was exhibited by Ron Parish on 1st Division Bench at the July Cultural Meeting. Six glistening flowers were beautifully displayed on a large plant and gained the award as Registrar's Flower of the Month.

SPRING SHOW 21ST-26TH SEPTEMBER 1987

SETTING UP SATURDAY 19TH SEPTEMBER

All displays are to be arranged on Saturday 19th September and are to remain in position until the following Saturday when members are expected to remove plants as from 1pm. Prior to 1pm and after 12.30pm all exhibitors are expected to assist in the dismantling of fencing and placing them in the loading bay. All areas are to be left clean and tidy.

NO PLANTS IN FLOWER OTHER THAN ORCHIDS MAY BE EXHIBITED--THIS INCLUDES ANTHURIUMS.

1. All exhibitors must be financial of The South Coast Orchid Club of South Australia Inc, for the period of at least ONE month prior to showing.
2. Entries are free.
3. Exhibitors are bound by the Constitution, Rules and By-Laws and Special Show Rules of the club.
4. The opinion of the Judges is final and binding, and no objections or discussion regarding results will be considered with the exception of an infringement by an exhibitor of any of the Club's Laws, By-Laws or Show Rules. Any objection in this case must be lodged with the Club Show Secretary.
5. The Club accepts no responsibility for any loss, damage or infection suffered by any plants or blooms exhibited.
6. The Club Reserves the right to photograph any of the exhibits if it should so wish.
7. In all matters regarding the arrangement and conducting of show (with the exception of judging) the Show/Marshall/Secretary is the ruling authority.
8. No plants suspected by the Club Virus Adjudicators of being infected with virus will be eligible for competition and such plants will be completely isolated from all other plants.
9. The exhibition areas will be closed during the judging. No exhibitors, public or members other than Show Marshall/Secretary, Judges of the club and Associate Judges and other persons appointed to assist in judging will be allowed to remain in the exhibition area during this period.
10. Non-exhibitors are requested not to congregate in the exhibition area prior to judging so that officials can arrange plants and perform other necessary duties unhindered.
11. Plants must be labelled with the correct coloured labels available from the club with the exhibitors number and name of plant. Supply of these labels can be obtained from the Show Marshall/Secretary or his nominee.
12. Exhibitors are to ensure that the labelling be neatly, and correctly performed in accordance with the procedure laid down on Orchid Nomenclature and Registration.
13. All exhibits must be arranged on the afternoon of Saturday 19th September 1986.
14. Exhibits must not be removed before 12.30 P.M. on Saturday 26th SEPTEMBER
15. Exhibitors unable to remove their own plants from the show should provide the person so doing with a letter of authorisation.
16. Damage caused in transit to the show should be reported to the Show Marshall/Secretary or Registrar of Judges prior to judging.
17. If in the opinion of the judges, a plant exhibited is not worthy of an award or prize in any specified section, then none shall be given.
