## A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PRESIDENT

It is with pride and satisfaction that I write this report pending completion of my term as your President. I highlight some of the positives that have occurred during this period.

- The brave decision that you made and supported me in that we shifted our meeting venue from Christie Downs to St. Mary's. I was always concerned that at some time we would have an road incident that could have affected member safety. It was becoming more difficult to get guest speakers to travel to Christie Downs, mainly due to the extended travel required.
- The acquisition of Pasadena Foodland as a venue for 2 shows a year at no cost to the Club. Pasadena allowed us to tap a new opportunity for members to join. Large shopping centres are a thing of the past for Orchid Shows. While you have the passing trade to sell to, the cost of approximately \$1,000 for a week's use is prohibitive and statistics show that very few new members were obtained from these venues, maybe it would be different now that we meet in the metropolitan area.
- The formation of your Species Group 2 years ago has proved a real positive in membership growth. One of the criteria we set some time ago was that our subgroups had to generate enough funds from their meetings to pay their costs of the venue used. It is pleasing to report that both groups are returning to the Club more than their costs to run. The Species Group has purchased in it's own right, a book on Oncidium Species from special funds that they raised at their meetings ( the first new book in some 4/5 years). This book is now part of the Club Library, together with the latest issue of Sanders List of Hybrids Registrations, an essential tool for our team of Judges.

One other area that has been a positive is the overall increase in membership of your Club over the period, this action has provided a sound base from which to promote the Club. A fantastic effort was made by the Garrrd Bros to promote the Club with a southern subgroup. After distributing approximately 300 flyers and letters as notices on various community boards and shops, only 1 response was forthcoming and that was from an existing Club member, perhaps it is worth another try.

An area that concerns me for the future, is that your Committee needs to develop programs that encourage more members to participate and get more satisfaction and value from the Club at monthly meetings and shows (from an active membership of Approx 100 people only 22 members showed plants at the Spring Show with similar numbers other shows). After all Shows and competitions are only a small part of the whole benefit of being aClub member.

In conclusion, I would like to thank your Committee, the Judges and you, the members for your support during my tenure as your President and hope will continue to do so under the leadership of Geoff Spear and his team.

This was a small seedling plant grown in small bark. It had two pendulous flower spikes with 14 and 22 attractive small flowers. The flowers had greenish brown sepals and petals. The labellum was solid reddish brown in colour that became a little paler towards the edge. The column was also a greenish brown and became a darker brown on the upper side towards its end. The pollen cap was yellow.
