Thank you to Jim Shaughnessy who has donated two bags of Bark to be raffled. Tickets available at all meetings at the Treasurers Desk.

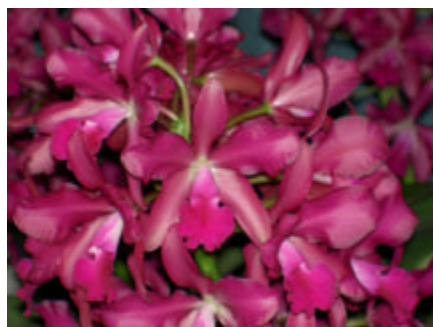

On the Bench at the April Meeting

Flower of Open Division: *Cattleya* Bactia 'Forever Yours' grown by Bev. and John Gay. A primary hybrid between *C. bowringiana* and *C. guttata* first registered in 1901 the large well grown plant had three lead growths each carrying a single inflorescences with 24, 22 and 20 flowers. Sepals and petals were purple, the darker purple mid-lobe of the labellum was broad and relatively flat with slight frilling around the edge and the purple side-lobes curved up over the column hiding it.

Flower of First Division: *Miltonia* Cogniauxiae (a primary hybrid between the species *Milt. regnellii* and *Milt. spectabilis* registered in 1856) benched by Rito Silvestri. It also occurs as a natural hybrid. The large well grown plant carried some 20 inflorescences of two or three open flowers and buds still to open. The flowers were 75 to 80mm across and 75mm tall. Sepals and petals were deep purple and the 35mm by 40mm flat labellum was a slightly lighter shade of purple with deep purple linear veining.

Flower of Second Division: *Cattleya* Valentine Day (*C. Intermedietta* x *C. Chocolate Drop*) grown by Jean Irvine. The inflorescence on the lead growth of this robustly growing plant of six pseudobulbs carried 13 flowers 60mm wide and 75mm tall. The sepals and petals were a glistening deep reddish purple. The labellum was a lighter purple with side lobes that curved up over the column and the flat well displayed mid-lobe was lavender-purple. The *Laeliinae* dominated the Open bench and were also shown in other divisions. A few *Cymbidiums* are beginning to appear as well as Australian native epiphytes and terrestrials. There were also a few *Paphiopedilums* and *Oncidiinae* benched. A few of the plants which caught the eye were:

Open Division.

Cym. dayanum benched by Don and Audrey Biebrick carried eight inflorescences with open flowers and two which were still in bud. The flowers of this species are quite small with petals that protrude forward over the column. The sepals and petals were a pinkish cream with a deep maroon central stripe of very fine spots. The labellum was dark maroon with a cream centre.



A pot containing several plants of the Australian native terrestrial species *Pterostylis truncata*, two of which were in flower, was benched by Kevin Weston. *Pterostylis* spp. are commonly called 'greenhood orchids'. The dorsal sepal curves up and forward to form a hood which in these plants was pale greenish white with dark greenish-brown stripes. The very pale green striped darker green lateral sepals were fused at their base and curved upwards with long darker green apical tails rising above either side of the hood. The other floral parts are quite small,

First Division.

Brassoeipilaelia (Bpl.) Freya was benched by Heather Engelhardt (there were also plants of this hy-

brid benched by members in both other divisions). This was a small plant carrying two inflorescences, each with three 50 to 55mm wide and 60mm tall flowers. Petals and sepals were a bright yellow shading to pale orange at their base. The contrasting oval shaped labellum, about twice as long as it was wide, was a slightly paler yellow and the column was pale yellow.

Terri Rees benched a small well-grown plant of *Paph. (spicerianum x Holdenii)*. It had two single flowered inflorescences and four new lead growths. Flowers were 90mm across and 80mm tall. The dorsal sepal had pinkish-purple parallel veining on a paler background, the ventral sepal was pale green with very pale purplish veining, petals light green overlaid pinkish purple and the labellum was very pale green overlaid purple with some slightly darker veining.



Second Division.

Wendy Lodge benched a small plant of *Blc. Makaha x C. Chocolate Drop*. It had four growths, the most recent one having an inflorescence with three 90mm x 90mm flowers. Sepals and petals were similar in colour, being pale green overlaid light brownish-yellow. The mid-lobe of the labellum had a purple splash, was yellow at its base and the yellow side-lobes curved up over the column. Ian Attenborough

The cost per leaf test is \$16.50 – and needs to be included in the envelope. In about a week from your action, you will receive a detailed report in writing about the electron microscope test that has been conducted along with a receipt for your money.

If you feel that your orchid is worth this cost, we advise you to take this action.

Recently a leaf, belonging to a member was badly marked, suspecting that a virus was present. The good news came back that it had no virus, it was a fungus that can develop when there is not enough air movement to dry the moisture from a leaf.

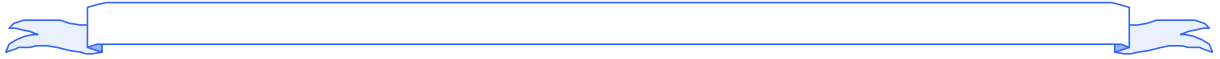
