SEEDLING COMPETITION 1979 - 1980

2. Plants will be selected by lottery ticket draw to match numbered plants.
3. Cost will be \$5 per plant.
4. Distribution will be at the November cultural meeting but members unable to attend that meeting may leave name and money with the Secretary beforehand.
5. Plants will be limited to one per member.
6. Two prizes will be awarded -
  - a. One for first flowering
  - b. One for best flowering
7. The competition will finish on 31/10/83
