EXHIBITORS' RULES FOR SHOWS

1. All exhibitors must be financial members of the South Coast Orchid Club of South Australia Incorporated.
2. Entries are free.
3. Exhibitors are bound by the constitution, Rules, By-Laws and Special Show Rules of the Club.
4. The opinion of the judges is final and binding and no objections or discussions regarding results will be considered, with one exception, which is an infringement by an Exhibitor of any of the Club's Rules, By-Laws or Show Rules. Any objection in this case must be lodged with the Club Show Marshall/Secretary.
5. The Club accepts no responsibility for any loss, damage or infection suffered by any plant or blooms exhibited.
6. The Club reserves the right to photograph any of the exhibits if it should so wish.
7. In all matters regarding the arrangement and conduct of the show (with the exception of judging) the Show Marshall/Secretary is the ruling Authority.
8. No plants suspected by the Club Virus adjudicators of being infected with virus will be eligible for competition and such plants will be completely isolated from all other plants.
9. The exhibition areas will be closed during the judging. No exhibitors, the public or members other than the Show Marshall/Secretary, Judges of the Club, Associate Judges and other persons appointed to assist in judging will be allowed to remain in the exhibition area during this period.
10. Non-exhibitors are requested not to congregate in the exhibition area prior to judging so that officials can arrange plants and perform other necessary duties unhindered.
11. Plants must be labelled with the coloured labels provided by the Club with the exhibitor's number and name of plant. These are available from the Show Marshall/Secretary or his/her nominee.
12. Exhibitors are to ensure that all labelling be neatly and correctly performed in accordance with the procedure laid down on orchid Nomenclature and Registration.
13. All plants benched for judging at the show must be made available to be in the club display for the show week.
14. All exhibits must be benched by the nominated time on the nominated day for judging. The nominated day and time will be published in the Club gazette in the month prior to the Show.
15. Exhibits must not be removed before nominated time on the nominated day at the end of the Display week. The nominated day and time will be published in the Club gazette in the month prior to the Show.
16. Exhibitors unable to remove their own plants from the show should provide the person so doing with a letter of authorization.
17. Damage caused in transit to the show should be reported to the Show Marshall/secretary or Registrar of Judges prior to judging.
18. If, in the opinion of the judges, a plant is not worthy of an award or prize in any specified section, then none shall be given.

Judges Comment on Flower of the Day:

The plant that won Judge's Choice and Popular Vote for the SRG May meeting was Bakerara Samurai (previously known as Oda. Samurai) owned by Grace Noll. This plant is not new to the competition table or at the Shows, and last year won Grand Champion at the SCOC Winter Show for Grace.

On the day it stood out with four upright racemes, the petals and sepals were an extremely dark red/black, with contrasting pristine white labellums. The very fine (spidery) flowers were positioned nicely around the racemes, and the plant was in pristine condition.

May Plant Commentary

Flower of Open Division and Flower of the Night: *Den. wasselli* benched by Noel Oliver. A very well grown plant mounted on a cork slab bearing ten well developed inflorescences each with ten to twenty open flowers. The flowers were approximately 20 mm. wide by 20 mm. tall. The narrow sepals and petals were white while the tiny labellum was yellow with tiny red/brown spots towards the flower's centre.



Flower of First Division: *C. Bactia* "Forever Yours" benched by Rito and Rosetta Silvestri. The plant had two inflorescences, the main one having eleven open flowers each being 70 mm. wide by 80mm. Tall. The other inflorescence had five flowers starting to open and another three still tightly closed. The sepals and Petals were even purple all over and the labellum was a very vibrant purple.



Flower of Second Division: *Paph. Lovelight* benched by Trevor Stutley. A clean well grown plant with one stem carrying one open flower and one further bud. The flower was 80 mm. wide by 85 mm. tall. Sepals and petals were white with very fine red spotting on the surface. The labellum was pure white and the disc (at the centre) was yellow overlaid with light green.

Autumn Show Plant Commentary

Grand Champion, Champion 2nd Division and Champion other Genera not otherwise listed: *Ctsm.* Francis Nelson 'Q.C.' benched by Trevor Stutley.

A very well grown plant with a single cascading inflorescence of 23 flowers, each 50mm wide by 35mm tall. All segments were green. The sepals had fine maroon spotting along the midline towards the centre. The labellum was also green with purple colouring in the midlobe.



Champion Open Division and Champion Laeliinae: *Pot.* Burana Angel 'Hysing' benched by Geoff and Lucy Spear.

A small but well grown plant with 2 inflorescences, one with 4 open flowers, the other with 4 open flowers and a bud. Flowers were 60mm wide by 70mm tall. Sepals were red/brown all over; the petals a little more red than the sepals towards the centre. The labellum was very showy with a deep red midlobe and deep yellow side-lobes edged red with a cream column.



Autumn Show Plant Commentary (cont.)

Champion First Division: *C. Bactia* 'Forever yours' benched by Rito and Rosetta Silvestri. A large plant with 2 inflorescences, one with 12 open flowers and the other with 8 open flowers and one bud. The flowers were 70mm wide and 80mm tall. The sepals and petals were pinkish purple and the labellum was bright vibrant purple. All of the segments were paler towards the centre.



Champion Zygopetalum: *Z. Titanic* 'June' benched by Peter and Geraldine Flavel.

A well known Zygopetalum with a single inflorescence carrying 5 well developed flowers. The colours were strong and shape very good with broad sepals and petals as well as a broad labellum.

Champion Cymbidium <60mm: *Cym. dayanum* benched by Geoff and Lucy Spear.

This was a very good example of this Australian species. It displayed more than 30 cascading spikes around the plant with their small flowers of cream sepals and petals with a deep maroon stripe down the centre. The petals folded forwards over the column and the labellum was deep red with a broad yellow stripe down the centre.

Champion Cymbidium 60 – 90mm: *Cym. St. Agnes Red* 'Canala' benched by Oui Ju and Michael Willoughby.

A well grown plant bearing flowers 65mm wide and 70mm tall. The sepals and petals were light maroon with a few darker spots on the sepals and somewhat heavier spotting on the petals. The mid-lobe of the labellum was heavy maroon with fine pale cream around the edges and cream towards the flower centre. The column was cream with red markings.

Champion Cymbidium >90mm and Champion Species: *Cym. traceyanum* 'Tambourine' benched by Des and Hazel Alsop.

A large plant carrying 5 inflorescences of flowers 105mm wide by 70mm tall. Sepals and petals were green with red-brown stripes along some of the veins and around the edge. The labellum had a yellow mid-lobe with a few maroon spots around the lightly frilled edge and a heavy red stripe down the centre.

Champion Australian Native: *Den. wasselli* benched by Noel Oliver.

This was a large plant mounted on a large sun-bleached slab of cork. The plant carried 10 inflorescences all of which carried many flowers with cream sepals and petals. The labellum and column were also yellow but darker.

Champion Oncidiinae: *Oncsa. Sweet Sugar* benched by Paul and Donya Hayes.

A well grown plant mounted on wood. It carried a single arching inflorescence with 8 side branches and bearing some 70 flowers in all. The small sepals and petals were pale green with light brown barring. The labellum, the 'Dancing Lady's Skirt' was deep yellow.

Champion Specimen: *Sngl. longifolia* benched by Geoff and Lucy Spear.

A pot of plants carrying 29 inflorescences with many flowers open along the stems. The flowers displayed well with light creamish-pink sepals and petals shading with fine pink spots which were much heavier towards the centre to form solid pink. The three-lobed labellum carried deep red spots on the outer end and the edge looked as if it had many small cuts giving a some-what 'ragged'
