SINGAPORE WORLD ORCHID CONFERENCE **13th – 20th NOVEMBER 2011**

A.O.C. have been able to arrange a very satisfactory set of prices through Flight Centre, Modbury for the WOC to be held in Singapore later this year.

The price (\$2228 pp) includes 7 night's accommodation (executive rooms at the Carlton Hotel, Bras Basah Road, next door to Raffles Hotel – breakfast included) together with return airfares Adelaide-Singapore-Adelaide. Private vehicle transfer is also included to and from the airport in Singapore. The Carlton Hotel also provides late checkout on the final day, with baggage hold until departure to the airport. The above quote was at 12/01/11, but I have been advised that Singapore Airlines have reduced this by a significant amount.

The WOC is being held in the Marina Sands Hotel which is approximately 1km away. There should be ample public transport available, buses and by that time possibly the train service will be extended. I think that there could also be buses organised by the WOC committee for registrants who are accommodated further away than walking distance.

The Carlton Hotel is at the marina end of Orchard Road.

Meeting Sunday 17th July 2011

Beginners' Class: In spite of a chilly day with an early morning frost in Victor harbor a good group of members attended to listen to President Geoff talk about the basics of growing orchids. He pointed out that orchids were the largest group of flowering plants on earth and explained some of the points relating to the taxonomy of the plants. He commented on the complex nature of the use of fertilizers and completed the session with an explanation of some of the terminology used by orchid growers. The group was told to never fertilize a dry plant. Watering and fertilizing should become part of a routine. If needed, due to different plant needs, a watering /fertilizing calendar could be kept.

Meeting Opened 2.0pm: President advised that we had recently celebrated our 46th birthday and it was good to hear that the club originated in Victor Harbor.

Guests and members were welcomed, including guest speaker Trevor Jacob and his wife Margaret.

Trevor has been a hobby orchid grower since 1962 and a judge since 1967. He gave an enlightening talk on 'Cool Growing Orchids' which may encourage more members to include other varieties in their Cymbidium collections.

He suggested that the following orchids could with a little extra care be grown in the same conditions as the Cyms. Zygotetalums, Cockle shell orchids, Stanhopea, Bifrenaria harrisoniae, Laelia Anceps, Bifoliate Cattleyas, Epidendrums, Oncidiums, Ondotoglossums, Slipper orchids and many Australian Natives.

Trevor showed us many interesting images of beautiful orchids and gave us some expert advice to help us achieve great results for our orchid growing endeavours.

July Plant Commentary

Flower of Second Division and Flower of the Night: *Cymbidium* Jessie Blakiston "Jean May" benched by Daniel Lutz. A well grown plant with two upright inflorescences, one with 15 flowers and the other with 16 open flowers and one bud. Sepals and petals were deep pink with a fine white edging. The labellum was cream with heavy maroon markings around the lightly frilled edge and with lighter coloured markings towards the throat. The red column had a cream pollen cap. The flowers were 70 mm across and 75 mm tall. Well done Daniel.



Flower of the First Division: Z (secundum x Titanic) benched by Rod and Judy McRedmond. A robust plant with an inflorescence on each of the new mature bulbs, the inflorescences carrying 6, 5 and 5 flowers which were well displayed. The flowers were 80 mm wide and 85 mm tall to 75 mm x 80 mm respectively. Sepals and petals were deep green with brown spotting and some barring. The labellum was lightly ruffled around the edge, was white with purple venation.



July Plant Commentary (cont)

Flower of Open Division

Phal. Carmen benched by Henk and Erna van Leuveren.

The plant displayed two inflorescences, one with four branches with a total of 19 open or opening flowers and 2 — 3 flowers in bud. The second inflorescence has four open flowers and some buds. Fully open flowers were 80 mm across and approx. 77 mm tall with other flowers still to fill out. Sepals and petals were dark purplish pink, cream towards the base and striped with red in that region.



A couple of other plants which caught the eye

L. anceps 'Alba' benched by Trevor Stutley.

The plant had two inflorescences, each with two flowers at the top of the stem. Flowers were 95 mm across x 115 mm tall. All segments were pristine white 30 mm wide and sepals were 15 mm to 17 mm wide. The labellum was mainly white but near the base shaded to yellow to mid green at the base.

Cym. hookerianum benched by Wendy Lodge.

This plant had a single arched inflorescence carrying eight flowers 120 mm across x 95 mm tall. The sepals and petals were green with fine red-brown spotting. The well displayed labellum was long and lightly filled around the edge of the mid-lobe with maroon spotting over the mid-lobe. The column was green with a cream/white pollen cap with a small amount of red linear marking.

It is good to see quality species on our benches. They are the base for our often more 'flashy' hybrids
