DAYTIME CHAPTER by Ruth Clark



An eyecatching display of orchids greeted members on arrival at the October Daytime Meeting. Keith Northcote's welcome included a special welcome to two new comers, Lloyd Cox and Bill Tretaskis and to Ray Goodall's first daytime visit. An apology was received from John Illman and a 'get-well soon' wish sent to Robyn Monkhouse who was unable to come and speak. However, Stephen deputized for her choosing 'Zygopetalums' as his topic.

The recent exhibitions had been most successful and seen by many folk who would not normally see an Orchid Show.

The raffle orchids included zygopetalums from Adelaide Orchids and miscellaneous plants from Guest Orchids.

Stephen has dubbed the zygos 'The Lady Bird Orchids' and they grow quite happily along with the cymbidiums. The growth pattern is also similar except the flower spike comes from the new growth, which means that on young plants flowering is much guicker. Potting medium and fertilization is also as for cymbidiums. Plants should be kept moist protected from winter rain which can cause black spot on the leaves. Colours are purple, chococolate and green with newer hybrids into the yellow/orange range. The flowers are highly perfumed. Growers are aiming for shorter spikes which will make plant more compact suitable for table decoration. Slides showed flower develop over the years with some newer plants having multiple flower spikes and more flowers. Some can flower two or even three times a year.

Stephen's choice from the display bench was Helen Edwards Slc. Mine Gold while members voted for her Phalaenopsis, Little Mary followed by Berna and Harry Viney's Cymbidium Hubert Cambourne with equal third to Viney's C. Trick or Treat and Helen's C. Penny Kuroda x intermedia.

Helen provided a special cake for afternoon tea to celebrate the 6th birthday of the Daytime Chapter. After Keith 'did the honours' this was enjoyed by all with their cuppa.

SARCOCHILUS by R. MOORE

The beautiful Sarcochilus have recently been in flower. Sarcochilus falcatus was first collected in 1802-3 by Robert Brown and taken back to England. These original specimens can still be found in the British Museum.

Sarco. falcatus is commonly

known as the Orange Blossum Orchid. In Victoria, New South Wales and Queensland it is found growing on trees, treeferns or by banks of streams or soakages, often in gullys or ravines, where there is always shade.

The flowers are white/cream with yellow markings on the labellum and also a mauve tip on the distal end.

The number of flowers on a raceme can be three to six, with large, well grown, plants producing 4 or more spikes from each growth.

This orchid grows epiphytically and the root system must be kept moist or well watered in the hot weather. The leaves are not glossy, even on the healthiest plants, and dehydration is often apparent and the leaves shrivelled. Root systems are not extensive when grown in cultivation but in nature can reach 3 to 5 metres long.

Sarco. falcatus is considered hard to keep growing in pot culture.

falcatus has been used in hybridizing and the progeny we often see on the show benches is Sarco. Melba which is Sarco. falcatus crossed with Sarco. hartmannii.
