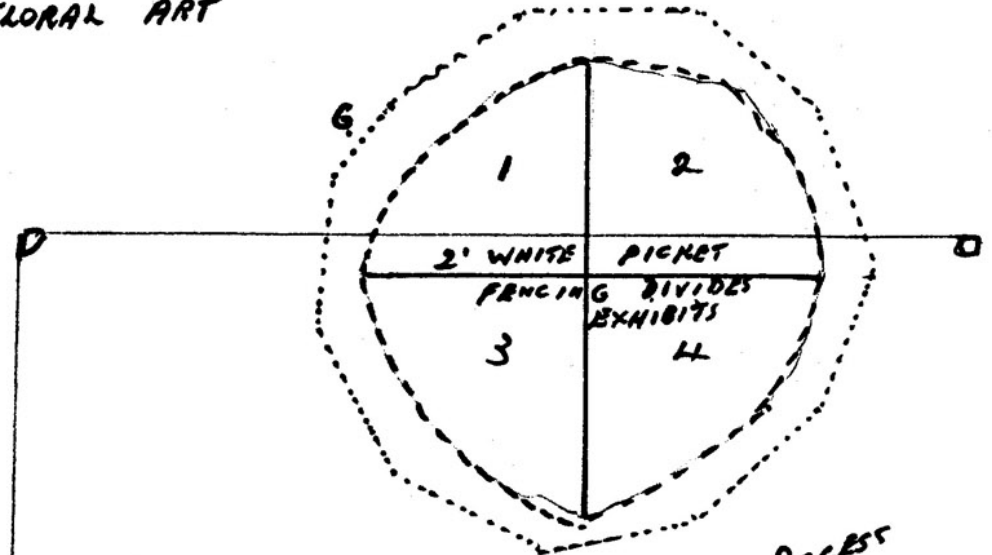

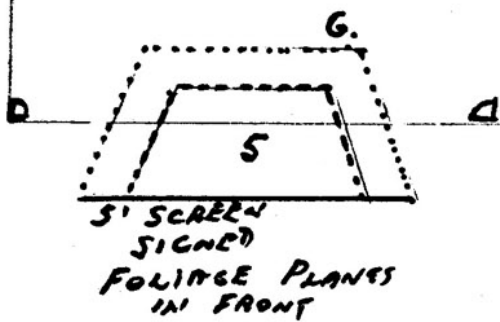

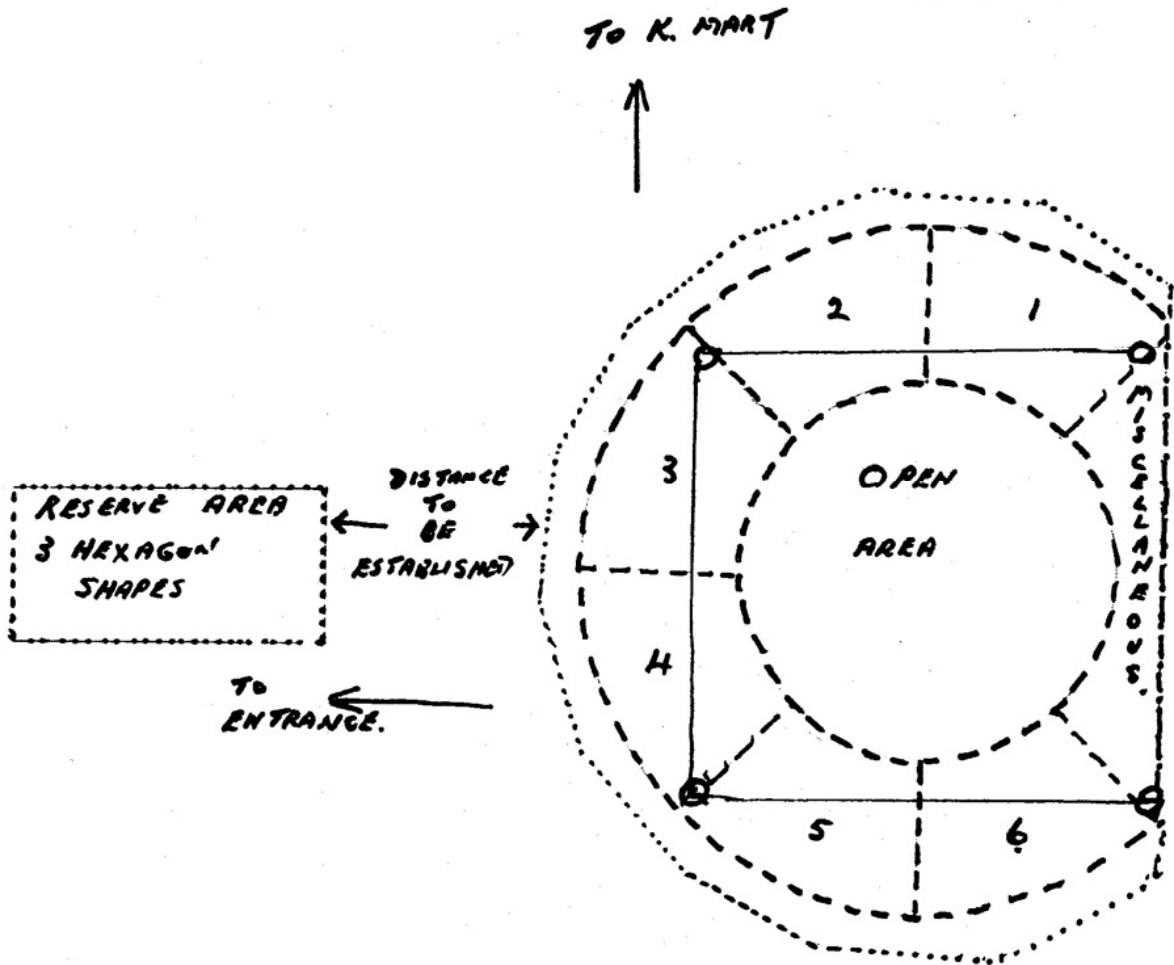

IMPORTANT MATTERS RELATING TO THE SPRING SHOW AND EXHIBITING.

DEFINITION OF 'SEEDLING'

There has existed a degree of uncertainty regarding the definition of a 'SEEDLING'. A seedling is defined as 'A COMPLETE CLONE THAT IS EXHIBITED FOR THE FIRST TIME AND THE EXHIBITOR MUST BE IN POSSESSION OF THE COMPLETE CLONE.' i.e. The clones shall not have been divided.

N.B. The essential variation is that it NEED NOT BE THE FIRST TIME OF FLOWERING.

This definition has been adopted by the Orchid Club of South Australia and is in line with the procedure in use by the other members of the Australian Orchid Council.

SPRING SHOW SCHEDULE

Provision is made in the prize schedule for a prize:-

Best of Group of Three Colours (any genera)

The attention of members is drawn to the fact that the prize is ESSENTIALLY A PRIZE FOR COLOUR, and as such shape will not be taken into account. Another important factor is THE MANNER IN WHICH THE THREE PLANTS ARE GROUPED IN THE DISPLAY.

The purpose of this prize is to encourage members to demonstrate to the general public that orchid plants have an attraction in their colour range. This ruling has been adopted by The Orchid Club of South Australia and is similar to a procedure that has existed at 'Orchidaceous'.

SPRING SHOW - ARRANGEMENTS FOR ACCESS

Our Spring Show for 1981 will occupy areas on two levels at Colonnades - namely for Open Division and Floral Art the Lower level as used previously and for 1st and 2nd Division the 'Upper level.'

Access to these areas will be as follows:-

Upper level - provided the exhibitor arrives after 12.30 and before 1.30 entrance can be obtained by bringing transport up to or through the door on the upper level. This door is reached by taking the road from Beach Road and to the left of the railway station proceeding as if approaching the main doors on the lower level. However, carry on driving behind the southern end of the Shopping Centre and proceed as if to park your vehicle in the car park serving the upper level. The entrance door is clearly visible with a curved canopy painted a bright yellow. At 1.30 this door will be locked and access will then have to be through the door on the lower level. Notwithstanding what was stated at the August Monthly meeting Colonnades do not wish the loading bay in the lower level to be overcrowded and members are requested to park their transport in the upper parking area. A guard will be stationed at the north central door and access can be gained to your vehicle quite readily.

For the exhibits on the lower level, access can be gained through the doors on the lower level.

AT BOTH LEVELS VEHICLES CAN BE UNLOADED BUT MUST NOT REMAIN IN THE BUILDING LONGER THAN IS NECESSARY. REMEMBER YOUR CO-OPERATION MAKES IT EASIER FOR THE OTHER MEMBERS.

Exhibitors will all leave the Centre through the north central door and it is strongly recommended that all exhibitors whether on the upper or lower level park their vehicles in the upper level car park.
