A message from your President

Monthly Meeting (Main Group)

44 visitors and 3 guests attended the September meeting and were treated to an informative talk and practical demonstration by the Guest Speaker, Graham Morris owner of Valley Orchids. Graham spoke on Cymbidium Orchid production and talked us by showing how a Orchid is pollinated and all those present were given a flower and shown how the transfer of pollen was carried out, for many a first time at pollinating an orchid flower. He then explained the developments that happen to the flower and the creation of a seed pod. A first hand look at a pod with many thousands of seeds ready for the Laboratory treatment and subsequent sowing of the seed to produce a uniquely original plant in a flask. Similarly the procedure for cloning of an existing plant. Graham and Geoff Spear deflasked a flask of little plants and produced a compost of each of the Flasks

Discussion took place re a compost planted out about a month before pointing out the rapid growth of the little plants. Well done to members who benched plants for competition on the night.

Day Time Group

17 members took part in a interesting afternoon with coordinator Jane Higgs and were entertained by Noel Oliver speaking on the Genus Dendrobium.

Species Group

Met on Monday night prior to Main Group meeting and those present examined and discussed the plants benched for both knowledge an understanding. Many of these plants are never seen outside this meeting by other than the owners due to the required conditions in which they live.

Spring Show

Just completed today as this article is written.

I must firstly congratulate those members who supplied plants both for display and trading table. In the words of Edda Viskic (President of O.C.S.A.) what a wonderful and colourful display of many differing genus.

The Store Owner was also very impressed, he believes it helps his business as many of the public come back for a second look and then buy something from the store and buy our trading table plants.

While final figures are not yet available I would expect our Sales would be up from the Winter Show thus consolidating our resources for the future. We have already started negotiations for future shows at this venue.

The display put up by the Species Group will be commented on elsewhere in the Gazette. We would expect as a result of interest shown that we will gain some new members from this show. Well done to all the winners.

South Coast Species Group

Spring brought out the Paphiopedilums to the Species Group meeting. The plain leaved cold growing Otopetalum or Paphiopedilum section of the genus was represented by the closely related plants, *P. villosum* and *P. annamense*. Both plants had very similar flowers but the difference was that the plant of *annamense* had a brown spotted yellow green dorsal and that of *villosum* had a brown stained similarly coloured dorsal. The spots were quite distinct on the *P. annamense* plant. Cribb treats these two species as variants within the species *P. villosum* along with the more well known *boxallii*. What's the difference between *boxallii* and *annamense*?

The fashionable genus *Dendrochilum* also appeared at the meeting. Two plants of *D. glumaceum* were in full flower displaying gracefully arching chains of small off white flowers with orange lips. What the genus lacks in

colour and flower size, it certainly makes up for in flower power and the strict, beautiful disposition of the flowers along the raceme.

Laelia furfuracea, grown on a section of wood showed us why this Mexican cool grower got its name. While the flowers are not as large as *L. anceps*, the plant can be grown as easily - cool and dry in the winter. The flower bases around the ovary were covered in dirty looking fine brown scales giving the light pink flowers and "unwashed" appearance at the base.
