AUTUMN SHOW - CENTRO COLONNADES



May Species Meeting

15 hardy souls met on a cold, rainy, blustery night to enjoy looking at and discussing some very interesting species.

The procedure we conduct at these meetings is that plants are placed on a bench at one end of the hall where members can look at them. Then, when the meeting is called to order, we sit around a table & each species is individually brought to the table from the display bench, passed around to the assembled members where the plant is discussed as to; where it originated in the wild, cultivation techniques with members relating their experiences with that species & any general points of interest.

The first plant we discussed was *Dendrobium formosum* a beautiful species from the Himalayas and Burma through to Thailand. The genus *Dendrobium* is divided into many sections, this one belongs to the section known as nigro-hirsute referring to the short, black hairs that cover the leaf sheaths. The flowers are carried on short inflorescences of 2 to 3 flowers up to 10cms, across more often 5 to 6cms in cultivation, on 50cm tall pseudobulbs. They are pure white & of good substance. There is a golden blotch at the base of the labellum & are slightly scented. Fairly easy to grow, not quite so easy to flower, will grow quite cool but does require some heat in the winter to be sure of flowering. Another very showy species benched was *Cattleya percivaliana* a *Cattleya* from the Labiata group. This group is referred to as the "labiata" or "unifoliate" group, distinguished by having just the single leaf on top of a pseudobulb. Early in the piece all *Cattleyas* from this group were named *Cattleya labiata*. They were discovered in great numbers and it was noticed that they were all similar to *Cattleya labiata* therefore were considered varieties of that species rather than as separate species in their own right. For many years *Cattleya percivaliana* was known as *Cattleya labiata* var *percivaliana*. This is one of the smaller flowered in the group but a lovely orchid. The flowers are 13cms across, nicely proportioned, colours varying from light to deep rose the labellum is paler in colour frilled around the edges with an orange throat veined with deep violet. It has a faint perfume that to some people appears as a musty rather unpleasant smell. This does not distract in any way from the beauty of this lovely orchid.

Quite a different orchid passed around for comment was *Dockrillia cucumerina* An Australian species that we don't see very often on the benches. It is a fascinating little plant having leaves looking like a mass of small gherkins giving rise to its specific epithet. The flowers, like all the *Dockrillia* species, are non-resupinate meaning the 2 to 10 greenish white flowers with purple striping appear upside down with the white wavy edged labellum uppermost. Can be difficult to maintain for any length of time in a collection. They do not like to be disturbed & once established should be left to cover the mount. They grow best on a mount of natural cork & given bright light, humidity and ample air movement.

Other species benched were *Liparis reflexa* (passed around the table very quickly!!) A nice specimen of *Cymbidium dayanum* A very well grown pot of *Doritis pulcherrima* carrying 5 erect spikes of deep purple flowers. *Laelia anceps*. *Epidendrum elongatum*. And an interesting plant of a *Cirrhopetalum* type *Bulbophyllum picturatum*.

Autumn Show, May 2007 Plant write-up

***Den. Alick Dockrill* - David and Kay Camack**

Well grown plant carrying a total of 7 inflorescences, two having all flowers open, 12 on one and six on the other, one with one flower open and four in bud only. Flowers were large pale cream sepals and petals with light pink overlay on their inner halve shading to maroon at their base. The cream labellum was maroon towards its base.

***Cym. dayanum* - Norm Woodend**

A very well grown and presented plant with 25 inflorescences arranged around the plant and cascading down over the pot. Most of the inflorescences had all the flowers open. The light cream sepals and petals were striped down the centre line with deep red and the side lobes and mid-lobe of the labellum were deep red and it was pale cream at its base.

***Lc. Royal Emperor 'Wade'* - Suzanne Saunders**

This plant had a single lead growth with an inflorescence carrying one shapely, filled in and flat flower 140mm wide and 150mm tall. The sepals and petals were a deep red and the full rounded and lightly frilled labellum was a darker red, shading to lighter at its base.

***Taurantha ophiglossa* (syn. *Ptst ophiglossa*) - Malcolm Guy**

A well grown colony of this species with 21 flowering plants' each bearing a single flower on an upright stem. The hooded dorsal sepal was white with green stripes and the light green fused and pointed (tailed) lateral sepals were oriented upwards with the tails protruding just above the "hood".

***C. Porcia 'Canizaro'* - Peter and Geraldine Flavel**

A well grown plant carrying three inflorescences of 10, 9, and 8 fully open flowers. Petals and sepals were a medium shade of lavender, the inner half of the petals having a slightly paler stripe along the midline. The flower was balanced by a deep purple labellum which was cream at its base and a cream column.

***Wils. Kolibri* - Suzanne Saunders**

Well grown small plant carrying a single branched inflorescence with 20 flowers. All the segments were mid lavender-pink heavily overlaid with dark maroon spotting and barring. The labellum was highlighted by a contrasting yellow callus (raised thickened tissue towards the base of the labellum).

***Paph. purpuratum* var. *Hong Kong* - Ron and Irene Parish**

The plant carried a well displayed single flower with a prominent dorsal sepal striped deep maroon with some pale green shading at the base all on a white background. The almost horizontal petals were a dark brownish maroon near the centre of the flower and shaded to a lighted pinkish maroon towards the ends which were white on the upper and lower edges and the tip. The labellum was brown with darker brown veining.

***Dor. pulcherrima* 'Red Giant' - Peter and Geraldine Flavel**

A very well grown plant carrying a single inflorescence with one branch. There were nine flowers approximately 2.5cm across with deep purple-pink segments, the labellum being a little darker than the other segments. A very attractive species.

***Zga. Kuinto* - Don and Audrey Bierbrick**

A well grown small plant carrying two inflorescences of five and four flowers and. The broad sepals and petals were light green spotted brown and the labellum was white edged, with purple venation darkening towards the base. The flowers were flat with the labellum almost at the same plane as the other segments.

***Sngl. Longifolia* - Geoff and Lucy Spear**

A pot full of plants with 31 upright spikes carrying many tiny light lavender-pink flowers spotted in darker purple-pink. The same coloured and marked labellum had a fimbriate (fringed) mid-lobe with five narrow segments.

***Lc. Alsaks Pattern 'Baldaceous'* - Suzanne Saunders**

This plant carried a single inflorescence with two flowers. Sepals were very pale pink and sepals and the very colourful cream to pale pink petals had a large bright yellow triangular wedge in their centre and were edged in deep purple with a large purple splash towards the ends. The labellum had similar colouring with the periphery of the mid-lobe deep purple and bright yellow at its base.
