#### ABOUT OUR SPEAKER THIS MONTH Denis Diehm (Dendi Orchids from NSW)

Dennis has been growing orchids for over thirty years, commencing with cymbidiums and then moving onto specialising in Phalaenopsis and Cattleya – both miniature and mid size.

All of this started as a hobby back in the seventies in a small backyard and like most orchid nurseries back then grew into a nursery. The orchids became too many for the backyard so in 1986 a move was made to a small acreage near Griffith N.S.W.

There Dendi Orchids was developed (the name comes from Dennis and Dianne) a Cymbidium nursery. The nursery was a covered area of one and a half acres of their five acre block. In the early nineties the cymbidium market was being flooded and due to Dennis's poor health he decided to change genera – he always had a soft spot for Phalaenopsis. All of the cymbidiums were sold and he then concentrated on what he now grows Phalaenopsis and Cattleya.

The breeding of both genera is carried out at the nursery by Dennis, who feels that top quality flowers can be produced in Australia without the need to import them.

Dennis has travelled to many places in the world and had been a speaker at conferences in other countries, his last being the Taiwan International Show and Conference in 2007.

He is an Australian Orchid Council judge and is currently the registrar for the South West Region of N.S.W., a position he has held since its inception in 2000. Dennis is also a member of the International Phalaenopsis Alliance and has been for some time.

May 2009 Benched Plant Commentary

Flower of Open Division and flower of the night: *Den.* unknown grown by Gerald Voskamp.

This was a most attractive plant with a single arching inflorescence with 11 open flowers and five buds. The flowers were 70 to 80mm wide and 70 to 75mm tall. The sepals and petals were deep purple-pink with a darker stripe down the centre line and the labellum was deep purple with cream colour at the base. Congratulations Gerald on a first ever Flower of the Night.

A well grown plant with three inflorescences of 8, 7 and 6 flat strongly coloured flowers. The dark green sepals and petals were spotted and barred deep brown and were complemented by the purple striped on white labellum.

### May species group meeting

Some 20 species in all shapes and sizes greeted the club members who attended the species group at the May meeting. 12 of which came from that huge subtribe of *Pleurothallidina*e. Various estimations have been made of the number of species in this subtribe and there are certainly well over 1000 species recognised.

There are many genera in the subtribe some of which are Stelis, Restrepia, Scaphosepalum, Zootro-

phium

Octomeria, Platystele and more. By far the greatest number is the Pleurothallis, alone accounting for around 1000 species. These numbers change virtually daily as new species are being discovered in the vast areas of the jungles of Central & South America many areas of which have still not been explored.

They are nearly all epiphytic growing on forest trees from sea level to 1600mtrs with just a few growing terrestrially. They do not have pseudobulbs and as a consequence, although a number have thick succulent leaves, they require high humidity levels. Only a few growers cultivate them in Adelaide and the species group is fortunate to have Ron Parish successfully

growing a large number of them that he regularly brings to the meeting. They are not great, large, showy plants like *Cattleya or Cymbidiums* but have small interesting typical orchid flowers that are best observed with a magnifying glass.

At the May meeting we saw 11 of his species of different genera, *Pleurothallis* tuerckheimii, P. macroblepharis, P. scripta, P.pachyglossa, Restrepia pelyx, R. rojo, R.sanguinea, R.rankinsteria, Platystele misera, Octomeria gracilis, Zootrophium atropupurum and Scaphosepalum decorum.

Australian species were represented by a lovely plant of Dendrobium lithocola atropurpureum and two plants of Dockrillia bowmannii. There was a nice plant of Oncidium

excavatum and a plant of the related Lockhartia oestedii. Also benched were Phalaenopsis amboinensis, Laelia perrinii and Gongora Galatea.

After much discussion of the species benched Ron presented a power point presentation on the genus Dendrochilum many of which we had never seen

The evening was concluded as usual with a friendly cuppa and chat.

#### 2009 Autumn Show Commentary

**Grand Champion and Champion of Open Division:** *Colm.* Wildcat Hildos No.1 grown by Noel Oliver. A well grown plant with a branching single inflorescence and carrying a total of 29 flowers 50mm wide and 60mm tall. The yellow sepals and petals were heavily spotted and barred in deep reddish brown. The large showy labellum was heavily marked with maroon on a creamish-white base.



**Champion of First Division:** *Cym.* Sundaani Autumn 'Gold 'n' Red' grown by Pauline and Mark Hockey. The plant had two inflorescences,

one with 14 flowers and the other with 12. The flowers were almost 60mm across at their broadest point. The sepals and petals were bright yellow shading to reddish brown at their bases, the yellow labellum was spotted in red around the edge and the column was also yellow.

**Champion of second Division:** *Den. lithacola* grown by Anne and Colin Campbell. This very attractive and well grown Queensland native had four inflorescences, one with five open flowers and four buds, one with three open flowers and two buds and there were two more less developed spikes. The purple contrasted with the labellum which was a much deeper shade of purple.

**Champion Dendrobium (other than Aust. Native):** *Den.* Woo Leng 'Blue Lip' grown by Peter and Geraldine Flavel. A well grown plant with two inflorescences, one having eight open flowers and the other with two open flowers and one bud. The sepals and petals were white shading to pale green at the base, the labellum was deep purple and the column was white. The flowers were 90mm across.

**Champion Laeliinae:** *Gsl. (Lc.)* Alsaks Pattern 'Boldaceous' grown by Suzanne Saunders. This plant had two inflorescences, each with three highly coloured flowers. The sepals were white, there was a large patch of yellow on the centres of the creamish petals and a border of cerise-purple. The labellum was similarly coloured but with a deeper purple patch on the mid-lobe and the column was white.

**Champion Paphiopedilum:** *Paph.* Albion grown by Tony Bourne. A small plant with a single flower. Sepals and petals were white, the petals being finely spotted with pale pink, and a white labellum.

**Champion Zygopetalum:** Z. (Titanic x Prospect Hill) grown by Ron and Irene Parish. This plant had a single inflorescence with four fully open flowers and two buds. Flowers were 70mm across and 75mm tall. The deep green sepals and petals were heavily barred with brown. The flat showy labellum was in much the same plane as the other segments and was heavily striped in purple on a white base.

# The orchids are not exempt from this rule No like pesticides-- -try Nepenthes Graeme Banks

Q I HAVE TROUBLE WITH ALL SORTS OF INSECT PESTS BUT I DO NOT LIKE TO SPRAY WITH IN-SECTICIDES IF SUCH CAN BE AVOIDED,

A WE HAVE A LARGE MIXED COLLECTION OF ORCHIDS INCLUDING CYMBIDIUMS, DENDROBIUMS (SOFT CANE MAINLY), CATTLEYAS, AUSTRALIAN NATIVES AND LOTS OF SPECIES. MOST OF THESE ARE GROWN 'COLD' IN A COMBINATION OF A BUSH HOUSE AND

A FIBRE GLASS HOUSE WHICH ESENTIALLY IS A BUSH HOUSE WITH A FIBRE GLASS ROOF. AS WOULD BE EXPECTED WITH A LARGE AND DIVERSE COLLECTION INSECTS CAN HAVE A FIELD DAY. THEY INCLUDE GRASSHOPPERS, COCKROACHES, DENDROBIUM BEETLE AND OTHER AS-SORTED NASTIES.

WE HAVE A LARGE COLLECTION OF NEPENTHES PLANTS (PITCHER PLANTS) ALL OF WHICH ARE SPECIES, OR HYBRIDS DERIVED THEREFROM, FROM MT KINABALU IN NORTHERN BORNEO. WHILST THEY COME FROM AN EQUATORIAL SITUATION IN NATURE THEY ACTUALLY ARE FOUND AT A VERY HIGH ELEVATION (8,000 FEET OR SO) WITH THE RESULT THAT THEY GROW LIKE WEEDS UNDER CYMBIDIUM TYPE CONDITIONS IN WESTERN SYDNEY.
