**DAYTIME CHAPTER by RUTH CLARK**

Keith Northcote extended a warm welcome to Mr and Mrs Garner and visitors who met with members for the September afternoon meeting.

Doreen Garner's topic was 'Oncidiums and related genera' and for these there are three main requirements -

- 1 Bright light
- 2 Fresh air
- 3 Water.

Hybrids can grow outside with the cymbidiums or hung above them either mounted or in pots. A suitable mount is cork - either first or second cuts. Doreen had bought examples to show the difference and how to mount

securely using either fishing line or panty hose. The latter is very useful for new mountings which should be towards the base of the cork as the plant likes to grow upwards. A little spagnum moss helps to keep the slab moist and encourages roots to attach to the cork. Mounts allow easy observation of roots to determine need for watering. Seedlings must be allowed to dry out between each watering which should be done, using 1/2 strength fertilizer, once a week during winter, twice weekly in Spring and twice daily on very hot days. Tree fern is not suitable for immediate use as a mount as it contains too much acid and needs to be treated for 12 months

before using or roots will go black and eventually die.

Doreen uses 80% shade cloth to prevent leaves bronzing because of too much heat but notices flowering is not as prolific as when 50% is used. When the days are very hot plants are transferred to a bush house.

Slides of some really beautiful oncidiums were shown.

As her pick of the benched orchids Doreen chose the unusual *Angraecum eburneum* grown by Charlie and Helen Edwards. Popular vote of members tied the above with Harry and Berna Viney's *Den. kingianum* for third. Second was Viney's C. Chocolate Drop x Lc. Trick or Treat. First was John Illman's Lc. Firedance 'Patricia'.

Discussion on preparation for the Spring Show and the Victor Harbor and Old Clarendon Winery Exhibitions kept everyone busy as the meeting ended with the usual cuppa.

### MELBOURNE TRIP by Jane Higgs

We left Marion On Friday morning at approx. 8am. with little luggage and lots of empty boxes! The bus we were travelling in was an old Pioneer Express Clipper, that was 'retired' in 1972 and became the touring bus for the rock group AC/DC for 4 years. It was then purchased by Des and Patsy Feary, the present owners,

who used it as a mobile home until 1991 when they converted it back to a comfortable bus and very distinctive in appearance, so much so that people stared or waved or both wherever we went. The appearance, however, didn't stop two of our group (who shall remain nameless) from nearly climbing onto the wrong bus at one of our stops!!

The journey went very smoothly (except for one twisted ankle) and we duly arrived at the Motel, which was spacious and very tasteful.

Leaving at 8.30am on Saturday morning we headed for Peninsular Orchids, who specialize in Cymbidium seedlings - they also had some paphs. The initial view of the Nursery was quite overwhelming because there were so many orchids, but we soon found our way around. After morning tea there, we left for Dingley Fern Market which was very interesting but not quite as impressive as the other nurseries. They had a mixture of orchids and it was interesting to see that most of the Cyms. came from South Australian nurseries. (Their wire, moss and fern, lifesize animals were wonderful and could be yours if you had \$1500 to spare for an elephant or dinosaur). The stop after this was at Collector's Corner, where we had our lunch in the cafe, on a mezzanine floor overlooking the orchid area. It was a very attractive outlook and whetted our appetites for a closer look. We weren't disappointed - it was a marvellous place with a large selection of many different types of orchids. They also have displays of bonsai, cacti, gemstones, shells and in fact, anything you could incorporate into a garden. We spent the rest of the afternoon there.

We chose a different hotel for Dinner that evening and we very pleased that we had. The serves, however, were rather large - one whole grilled flounder arrived hanging over the edge of the 12" oval plate. The food was delicious and it was a very pleasant evening.

We had a 7-30am start on Sunday morning and stopped at Mandurang Nursery near Bendigo at about 10.30am. We were greeted by the owners and a beautiful BIG Great Dane dog whose head was about level with most people's elbows. This was another interesting nursery with mainly Cymbidiums but also some Australian natives. When we left they presented us with a box of plants for a bus raffle. (as did Dingley and Collector's Corner). We then headed home -which was just as well as we would have had trouble fitting another orchid on the bus.

All in all, the trip was a wonderful experience, and I'm sure everyone joins me in thanking Dale and Lesley for their efforts in making it a great success.

We look forward to whatever is in store for us next year.
