The guest speaker, Bev Carpenter, a judge of South Coast, gave a very interesting talk of her visit to the 12th Australian Orchid Conference Show held in Perth in September.

the Show The theme for 'Orchids are fun in '91' and was very well illustrated in various displays by local growers. The Show also included exhibits by interstate and overseas societies and growers.

Andy Easton, a New Zealander whom some of you will remember from '86, won Orchids the Grand Champion Orchid with a beautifully grown and flowered Paphiopedilum 'Sandstone'. Picture Rock Orchids of Nambour. Robertson Queensland, won the Reserve Champion with Phalaenopsis (Arai X Musashino) Whangarei Society, from New Zealand, put in an excellent cut-flower display that won First Prize in the overseas society category.

The central point of the Show was sized Merry-Go-Round. ful1 Featured in the displays were clowns, a Punch and Judy Show, and many other ideas to blend in with the variety of orchids and the theme. Another feature of the show was a Floral Art Display.

At the conclusion of the talk Bev showed a number of slides of the show.

Popular vote was won by Blc. Kebir grown by H. Viney with 4 large mauve-purple flowers Illman's Oncidium Golden Sunset 'Taka', a very nice red and white on a small plant, coming in second, but also being chosen by Bev Carpenter as her choice of the plants benched.

The meeting concluded with the usual cuppa and friendly chat.

NEW CATTLEYAS

From notes given to me by Rob Worden after he addressed the September Cultural Meeting.Ed.

When asked to present this talk earlier this year I approached three overseas and one Australian nursery to obtain information. To my surprise the approach they took varied considerably. i.e.

Fordyce: Slides of first flowering seedlings & a list of current crossings in the flask.

Stewarts: Slides of a few new hybrids with information of their flower size and the parents used. Miyamoto: A few new seedlings, tried and true parents.

Aranbeem: Slides of new plants that have received show recognition.

From this exercise I have learnt that one has to be very specific.

Here's a little of the history of each nursery.

Fordyce Orchids: Frank is considered an authority in the Mini Cattleya field. He has had many years of growing and hybridising in his own nursery and for Stewarts and Rod McLellan. For his breeding program he has access to a large gene pool The U.S. market for Fordyce Orchids consists mainly of -

1 Pot Plant: Sell flowering plants that are thrown away when

flowers die.

2 Require plant to bloom quickly (2 years out of flask) so that the glasshouse is cost efficient.

Bright colours on small plants that are appealing. 4 Anything different i.e. Encyclia X Slc. Current trend for Fordyce is to cross Mini with Standard size Catts in the hope that larger blooms on dwarf plants will result. (Bet mine will be small flowers on standard growth) In the Laboratory Fordyce has -Pot. Aussie Pet X Slc.California Apricot Bic. Drumbeat X Sic. Hazel Boyd Epi. nemorale X C. harrisoniae Slc. Dixie Jewels X Precious Stone California Apricot loddigesii The Australian Agent is Royale orchids & Adelaide Orchids also have a few.

Stewarts were established in about 1941. Primarily they produced Standard Mauve-Purples. Recently (1988) they combined with Armacost & Royston. Now they have white, purple, mauve and pinks. They grow cyms, catts, phals, paphs, and miltonias.

Their breeding program briefly is to expand the colour range and flowering season of standard cattleyas, but also on a smaller scale, keep on with proven minicatt. breeders i.e Slc. Precious Stones.

Stewarts are currently producing summer flowering standards of reasonable shape.

Australian distributor, Royale Orchids, has currently flasks of crosses that will not be offered to the U.S. public for sometime.

Miyamoto Orchids is a Hawaiian company founded by the late Masatoshi (Miya) Miyamoto. Currently the company is run by his wife Helen and son Calvin. Miya bought his first orchid in 1936 and started Miyamoto Orchids in 1946.

DENDROBIUM linguiforme grown by Michael Cunningham

This delightful specimen of the tongue orchid growing on a portion of a small branch had about 20 spikes each of 12 to 20 flowers of glistening white. It is a widespread native orchid in eastern Australia from northeastern Qld. to south-eastern N.S.W. and grows in a range of habitats from trees in the rainforests to rock formations in open forest. In cultivation it is reputed to be an easy orchid to grow and is best suited to slab culture. However as with many species orchids some specimens perform better than others, but it is still worth a try. Congratulations Michael on a well grown and flowered plant.
