SPECIES GROUP

Over 30 species orchids were shown with epiphytes and terrestrials on show.

Cattleya skinneri var *alba*, *C. skinneri* 'Snowburst', *C. skinneri* var *occulata*, *C. skinneri* var *amythestina*, and *C. skinneri* 'purple' were all slightly different and beautiful specimen plants.

Oncidium sphacelatum, *Onc. haematophyllum* and a tiny *Tolumnia* as well as a *Zygopetalum crinitum*, *Diacrium bicornutum* and *Bifrenaria harrisonianum* were an interesting group from South America. Mention was made of the fact that these all require high light for successful flowering. The *Cymbidium* was well represented with six spp. including, *Cym. floribundum* which was a sweet

miniature, *Cym. insigne* was an upright pink standard, *Cym. lowianum* was in two forms and the newly discovered *Cym. erythraeum* was described as very floriferous three times a year.

Dendrobium densiflorum, *Den aggregatum* and *Den pieradii* were very colourful and pendant subtropical flowers. The Australian native terrestrials included *Caladenia tentaculata*, *Microtis uniflorum*. *Calaeana major*, *Calochilus robertsonii*, and the Australian Native epiphyte species was *Sarcochilus fitzgeraldii*. With the slender *Eulophia gracilis* and the wiry *Phalaenopsis leudemanniana* tempting our senses we enjoyed the wide variety of the late Spring flowers.

CONSTITUTION

Our club solicitor Harry Lambert has bought our constitution up to date with all the requirements requested by consumer affairs. as listed here

THE SOUTH COAST ORHID CLUB OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA INCORPORATED I refer to your application for alteration to rules for the above named association lodged with this office on the 3 February 2004. Before this office can proceed with the application, the following matters require your attention.

Include in the association's rules a paragraph stating the powers of the association (see rule 4 of the enclosed example of rules).

clause 30 of your constitution states "The club may be dissolved at any time upon resolution carried at a General meeting of the club in the same manner as a resolution to amend the constitution-" This is in contradiction to the Associations incorporation Act 1985 (the Act) section 41(6) which states; "An incorporated association may, by a special resolution, resolve that it be wound up voluntarily. special Resolution is defined by the Act as follows;

A special resolution " of an incorporated association mensa) where the rules of the association provide for the membership of the association - a resolution passed at a duly convened meeting of the members of the association if (i) at least 21 days written notice specifying the intention to propose the resolution has been given to all members of the association; and -2(H) it is passed at a meeting referred to in this paragraph by a majority of not less than three quarters of such members of the association as, being entitled to do so, vote in person or, where proxies are allowed, by proxy, at that meeting;

Also ensure that the following text is written or printed on the constitution, and completed by a JP. This is the annexure marked A referred to in the statutory declaration of

PART 3 Associations. Incorporation Act 1985 25

(6) The commission is entitled to appear and be heard in relation to an application under this section.

Powers of an, incorporated association

25. For the purpose of carrying out its objects, an incorporated association may, subject to this Act and its rules

(a) acquire, hold, deal with, and dispose of, any real or personal property; and

(b) administer any property on trust; and

(c) open and operate All accounts; and

(d) invest its moneys

(i) in any security in which trust moneys may, by Act of Parliament, be invested;

or

(ii) in any other manner authorised by the rules of the association; and

(e) borrow money upon such terms and conditions as the association thinks fit; and

give such security

g for the discharge of liabilities incurred by the association as the association think fit; and

(g) appoint-agents to transact any business of the association on its behalf; and enter into any other contract it considers necessary or desirable.

26. (1) contracts may be made by or on behalf of an incorporated association as follows:

(a) a contract which, if made between private persons, would be required to be in writing under seal may be made by the incorporated association under its common seal;

(b) a contract which, if made between private persons, would be required to be in writing signed by the parties to be charged may be made on behalf of the association in writing by any person acting under its authority, express or implied;

(c) a contract which, if made between private persons, would be valid although made by parol only may be made by parol, on behalf of the association by any person acting under its authority, express or implied.

(2) A contract may be varied or rescinded by or on behalf of an incorporated association in the same manner as it is authorised to be made.

Limitation of doctrine of - vires

27. (1) A contract made with an incorporated association is not invalid by reason of any deficiency in -the capacity- of the association to enter into, or carry out, the contract unless the person contracting with the, association has actual notice of the deficiency

Your association may wish to exclude or modify any of the powers contained in section 25. If this is the case, list the details under this rule. The powers of the association are subject to the Act and these rules.

The association shall have (a) 1 the powers conferred by section 25 of the Act.

5. MEMBERSHIP 5.1 TYPES

Your association may have more than one type of membership eg. ordinary member or a social member.

If so, insert a separate sub-clause describing each class of membership and how an applicant becomes eligible for each class. Any person who, (specify any qualification for membership eg. any person who supports the objects of the association and agrees to be bound by its rules) and who applies for membership of the association shall be proposed by one member and seconded by another member. The application for membership shall be made in writing signed by the applicant and the proposer and seconder. upon the acceptance of the application by the committee and upon payment of the first annual subscription, the applicant shall be a member of the association.

5.2 SUBSCRIPTIONS if your association has different types of membership listed in the above membership section, then you must state the subscriptions due for each type.

a. The subscription fees for membership shall be such sum (if any), as the members shall determine from time to time in general meeting.

b. The subscription fees shall be payable annually on 1 July or at such other time as the committee shall determine.

c. Any member whose subscription is outstanding for more than three months after the due date for payment shall cease to be a member of the association provided always that the committee may reinstate such a person's membership on Such terms as it thinks fit.

5.3 RESIGNATIONS outline the procedure to be followed should a member wish to resign from our association. A member may resign from membership of the association by giving written notice thereof to the secretary' or public officer of the association. Any member so resigning shall be liable for any outstanding subscriptions which may be recovered as a debt due to the association.

The constitution will be available at December meeting, please read it carefully and at the A.G.M in February you will be asked to vote its acceptance.
