The year 1981 is being spoken of as a year in which the needs of Disabled/Handicapped persons can be considered.

As an activity and forming part of our Winter and Spring Shows, our Club will be featuring how Disabled/Handicapped persons can cope and derive pleasure in the growing of certain types of orchids. pleased to inform members that the firm of W A Young & Co will be providing the Club with an Economy size sarlon shadehouse together This will be on display at both our with three tier benching. Winter and Spring Shows together with appropriate orchid plants. A decision has been made that the shadehouse, benching and a quantity of orchids shall be raffled and that the proceeds shall go to an approved organization assisting Disabled/Handicapped persons. initial approach to some Club Members, your Committee has already received strong support. The opportunity is now given to all Club Members to become involved in this act of Charity and to donate plant or plants to be included in the prize schedule. be that the plant which you have to offer is not entirely suitable but please still donate it. Your Committee can use it to advantage. What is desired is sufficient plants to build the prize schedule up to a size that will encourage the selling and buying of raffle tickets.

We are not going it alone! An approach was made to the Southern Districts Committee of 'Lions' consisting of representatives of their Christies Beach; O'Halloran Hill; Clarendon; Noarlunga; and Southern - (Moana, Maslins, & Willunga) - Branches and they have enthusiastically agreed to undertake the selling of raffle tickets. Additionally the 'Lioness' groups will be involved. The opportunity will be given to South Coast members both to sell and buy tickets.

Discussions have been held with both 'Lions' and the Dept of Community Welfare (Noarlunga Branch) and it has been ascertained that there exists in the Noarlunga area (as we understand it it is the only one) an organization for Disabled/Handicapped persons known as 'Seawinds'. It is an organization which cares for the needs of handicapped children and is associated with the Noarlunga Family Services Board. It also receives financial assistance from the State Govt. The proceeds of the raffle will be used to provide equipment/facilities not otherwise available. What is important to know is that by reason of the fact that raffle tickets can be sold to the extent of 5 times the value of prizes offerred, that the plant which you are prepared to donate will realize 5 times it's retail value?

THE SOUTH COAST ORCHID CLUB OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA INCORPORATED. REPORT OF MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE 1980.

In submitting the Report for 1980, your Committee believes that all the principal activities of the Club - the monthly cultural meetings, the floral art meetings, and the Winter and Spring Shows - proved highly satisfying to members. The President's Flower-of-the-Month competition started in April 1978 continued to arouse wide interest. Glass drinking tumblers bearing the Club's badge have proved popular prizes. All the speakers at the cultural meetings, the trading table and the suppers each month added their special touches to the spirit and social wellbeing of the Club. It was a busy year and a happy one, although it ended on a sad note with the passing of our dear friend Mr. Harry Krastins. Harry and his wife Erna were stalwarts of the Club for many years.

<u>CULTURAL MEETINGS</u> - The Club held 12 monthly meetings with varied and comprehensive programmes as recorded in the Gazette. A plant competition was conducted at all meetings except for December (Christmas Party, and Presentation of Prizes.)

COMPETITIONS - The monthly plant competitions have been well supported and provide a valuable means for members appreciation and education. In the yearly aggregate a number of members won prizes in each Division. Mr. John Nicholls proved to be the most successful exhibitor for the year with a total of eight prizes. The Sleeping Mist (Pharoah x Sussex Dawn) seedling competition was won by Mr. John Leeder. During 1980 four Second Division members won five or more major prizes and thus have graduated to exhibit in either the First or Open Divisions as may be chosen at the beginning of the year. In regard to the Winter and Spring Shows, the Club took the positive action of moving its venue from Marion to Colonnades, closer to its meeting place in the Noarlunga District. Our first public Winter Show earnt the Club a Certificate of Merit from the City of Noarlunga. Both Winter and Spring Shows received most favourable public reaction. The Winter Show was the first week long show to be held in the Adelaide area at that time of the year. Besides all those Club members who helped make these shows so successful were the untiring efforts at all times of our Show Secretary Mr. John Leeder, who gained such fine support for the Club from Colonnades Merchant's Association and Colonnades Management. To them and to all our friends at Colonnades we record our appreciation and look forward to a continuing, mutually useful association in 1981.

The Grand champion of the Winter Show was H. and B. Lambert's Banadarella x Sarella 'Beverley' Paphiopedilum. The grand champion of the Spring Show was Glen Forrest's Balkis 'Compact', and the prize-winning exhibits were those arranged by Leora Harvey and Dulcie Grave, Bubs Gready, H. and B. Viney and M.C.Strout.

Analysis of home work followed by a demonstration of an arrangement will start at 7.45 p.m. and finish at 8.30 p.m. The rest of the allotted time will be spent working in class on your arrangements, so please all bring suitable materials and containers for same.

HOMEWORK

DEMONSTRATION

Modern line arrangement, using 1 or 2 containers.

WORK IN CLASS

For new members some tall background material (several pieces) such as umbrella grass, flax leaves, aspidistra leaves, tree foliage, etc, which may be fresh or dried. Several flowers grading from bud to large flower for focal; if possible, suitable container, a pinpoint, (which can be bought from the Club), small amount of plasticine and something suitable for cutting foliage stems etc. For the container a fairly shallow salad bowl or similar plastic container is quite good, it may be round, oval, square or oblong.
